Mr. Bob Daniel of the Belton Cemetery Association will share the latest upgrades and improvements to the cemetery.



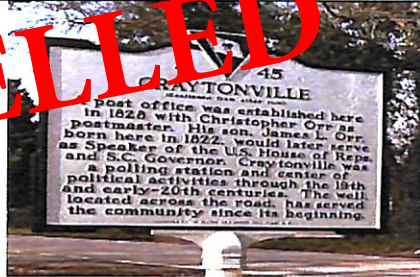
July 5th

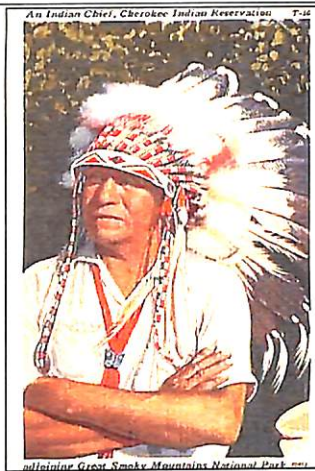

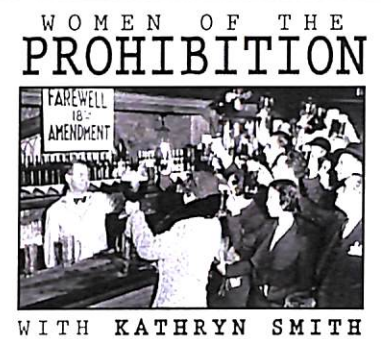
May 4th

Best-selling author and well-known Andersonian, Kathryn Smith, will present "Women of the Prohibition".



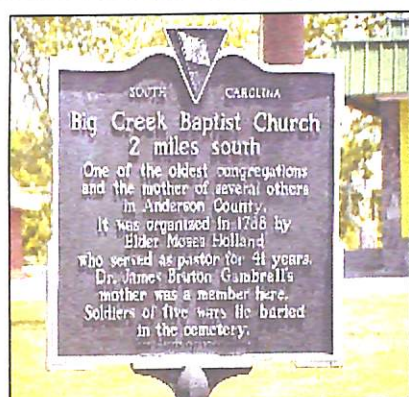
November 2nd
