



Tony Draine, Workshop Committee Chairman, has recently sent us information regarding the 18th Annual Workshop. It will be held July 15, 1989 at Columbia College. The theme for this year's workshop is "Genealogical Research: Methods and Sources for the Advanced and the Beginning Researcher". Registration, which will include lunch in the college dining room, will be \$14.00 for members, and \$16.00 for non-members. The names of the speakers and topics will be announced within the next thirty days.

Each Chapter is asked to set up a display table to sell books printed by them, or any other material that will be of interest to researchers. There are usually a number of "out of town" and local publishers who set up tables and sell their books. This always proves interesting, because of the number of books available for sale, and the variety of subjects offered.

Last year we had eight members going to the workshop, let's plan for more this year. Some can go and share a room on Friday night, and split the expenses, o drive over on Saturday morning. As we get additional information, we will relay it to you. Plan now for a fun and educational experience!

Chapter Representative:

Mr. Ronald Kay, newly appointed Chapter Representative, attended his first meeting on 28 January 1989. He brought back some very good information we would like to share with you.

Our Membership for the Society now totals 1005 persons. There was a total of 135 new members to join in 1988. An updating of the Surname Index was mentioned, but no action was taken. The deadline for the cemetery survey is July 1989, which will consist of the names of the cemeteries, and their locations. Reverend Syfrett donated to each Chapter back issues of the "Carolina Herald". The death records as reported by Alexia Helsey, have been completed for 1915-29. SCGS is underwriting the cost to film 1929-38. location of the Society Repository as reported by Risher Fairey, is the offer made by the Edgefield Chapter as a previous Board meeting be strongly considered because of it's easy access; State and Local level official records could be accomodated; State and Chapter publications for sale could be housed, and other points in it's favor. Concerning access to death certificates, House Bill 3031 from The Honorable Dell Baker, Greenville, recommends that the 50 year restriction be done away with entirely, and that a 25 year restriction be in force. Dr. Jordan closed the meeting stating that a short history of each Chapter will be distributed at the Annual Meeting to be held in Camden. Our thanks to Ron for being such a good reporter!

The McCrorey Family

The McCrorey family of Fairfield had as it's progenitor in Scotland, Allen MacRaurie,, who married into the Clan Ronald McDonald, and became chief, and taking the part of "Bonnie Frince Charlie" after the battle of Culloden, fled to North Ireland County Antrim. From there, members of the McCrorey, Turner, Adger, and Law families came to Fairfield County, SC.

William McCrorey (1745-1838) was the first of his name in Fairfield. He came there in 1790, having previously married in Ireland, Margaret Adger (1747-1805). They brought three minor children with them: John, who married Mary Largaret "Molly Peggy" Turner; James, who married Jane Crawford; and Susan, who married William Adger.

John McCrorey: (1773-1849) by his wife, Molly Peggy Turner, had seven children: James A., 1802-1893, who married Sarah Lunday Thorn; Thomas, who married a Mis Peydon; Martha, who married Dr. William Thorn; Susan, married Daniel McCullough; Elizabeth "Betty", married Mr. Matthews; Agnes, married John Richmond; Margaret Miller, who married James Adger.

The foregoing reared families, who are mostly buried at Mt. Olivet Presbyteria Church.

James McCrorey, who married Jane Crawford, had two sons; James, who married Lucretia Mobley; and John, who married Dorcas Mobley. Both had large families. Susan McCrorey, who married William Adger, had a number of children also. Some lived in Fairfield, and others in Charleston. The Smyth Family of Charleston are some of their descendants.

James A. McCrorey, (son of John and Molly Peggy Turner McCrorey), who married Sarah Lunday Thorn, lived to be nearly 92 years of age. He was one of the most highly respected men of his day, and had a most kindly disposition. When past four score, he would ride horseback to Winnsboro, and then back home. It is told of his Great Grandfather, Adger of Ireland, owned a linen mill, and that his stamp on a bolt of linen caused acceptance without measurement. Capt. Ellison A. Smyth, now of Flat Rock, NC, has that stamp.

In the Confederate War, James A. McCrorey, had three sons to serve; James Law, William Turner, and John McCrorey. James Law McCrorey was imprisoned at Ft. Delaware, NJ., where he died. He kept a diary, a copy of which has been deposited in the Library at the University of South Carolina. It is a classic and gives an intimate picture of prison life.

James left a widow, Mrs. Mary Adger McCrorey, and four children: Adger, Marv. E. (Mrs. James Ragsdale), John Turner, and William Adger McCrorey.

William Adger McCrorey was one of the bodyguards who conducted President Jefferson Davis as far as Charlotte, NC.

Two other children of James A. and Sarah Lunday Thorn McCrorey, were: Sarah, who married Capt. James Beaty, of Winnsboro; William Turner (1834-1921), married Miss. Mattie Hawthorne, who had nine children: Minnie E., married Most. H. Mobley; Emma A., second wife of Mose H. Mobley; Nannie Lee, married Pickett McCullough; Sarah, married Edward D. Mobley; Martha, married Thomas Woodward Starnes; James Law, married Maude Edwards; Lou, married J.F. Keller; Sue, married T.T. Farr; and Hawthorne, who married Eulalie Ragsdale.

Note: The above Family History was submitted by Ernest C. Simpson, P.O. Box 681, Iva, South Carolina, 29655. This article, according to Mr. Simpson, appeared in a Winnsboro newspaper around 1942. His Grandmother Simpson nee McCrorey, is a descendant of the Adger and McCrorey Families.

NEWSPAPERS - A VALUABLE RESEARCH AID:

While abstracting the Intelligencer for 10 October 1894, we came across this article filled with genealogical material. The title, "After An Absence of Forty Years", by William M. Gantt. (Tells of leaving Fork Section of Anderson County to live in Alabama 40 years ago).While in the Confederate Service from Alabama, at one point of war he was within 20 minutes of his home while crossing the Savannah River at Harper's Ferry (Abbeville County). He named a number of people he knew who have since died, then tells of visiting his brother, James A. Gantt, in Townville. He and brother visited their old home place on the Little River, Abbeville County, and found grave of GGGF Addison Gantt, who came here from NC and died 1807 (Abbeville County). A singular request of being buried at the edge of his yard was complied with, and his wife, a Miss. Wood, was laid beside him. These are the only graves there and all traces of old home are gone. Nearby is the Old Duncan Graveyard where my GF Frederick Gantt who died in 1814 is buried along with his wife. In 1831 my father moved to Craytonville (Anderson County) to live for 13 years, then in 1844, moved to the Fork where he died in 1851, age 50. He mentions attending school at Mt. Bethel in 1838 with Rev. Wilson Ashley, teacher, and then in 1839 went to school at Big Rock in Craytonville. Some of his schoolmates were Harvey, Lawrence, and Jehu, sons of Christie (Christopher) Orr. Harvey and Jehu went to MS and became prominent lawyers and Judge. Harvey has been dead a few years, but Jehu Orr is still living in Columbus, MS. We visited George Long, friend and Army comrade of my brother James..."

By checking cemetery records "Smith's Book of the Dead" for Anderson County, we find James A. Gantt 25 Feb.1826-15 Nov. 1904, with wife Johanna, 6 Oct. 1829-18 Feb. 1918; John C. Gantt 26 July 1834-3 Jan. 1907, and wife Matilda J. King, Sept. 1848-28 August 1929, married 30 March 1878; John W. Gantt, 4 April 1801-8 July 1851 and wife Jane, 1796-18 Nov. 1873.

In another article, "Souvenir Edition of 1896", Intelligencer, page 24. "John C. Gantt, born 26 July 1834 near old Craytonville, Anderson County, son of John W. Gantt whose ancestors came from NC to Abbeville County and were of Welsh stock. His mother, Jane Mattison, was a native of Prince William County, VA. John W. Gantt moved from Craytonville to Fork in 1844. In 1873, with brother (James C. Gantt) opened a store in Townville. He was Steward of Smith Chapel Church."

Obituary - 4 Jan. 1907.

John C. Gantt died at his home in Broyles, Fork Township, midnight 3 Jan. 1907, age 70. Leaves widow, Matilda King, and 4 children, 2 sons and 2 daughters (Named a daughter, Mamie). Had country store in his home for many years. Was on Board of Commissioners and belonged to Smith's Chapel where he was buried 11 AM, 5 Jan. 1907.

Obituary - 16 Nov. 1904.

Baptist Church where he will be buried today. Survived by wife and 3 children: 1/ John W. 2/ Mrs. J.M. Broyles 3/ Mrs. M.B. Gaines.

And Last:

"History of Saluda Baptist Association", T.H. Garrett, pages 282-3.

Cador Gantt, son of William Gantt, born 15 April 1771, NC. Moved to Abbeville County, SC, where in early manhood united with Little River Baptist Church... died 2 Dec. 1848, married Sarah Pratt, daughter of William Pratt, who survived him several years reaching advanced age of 102 years.

"Little River Baptist Church, Level Land, (Abbeville) SC".

Cador Gantt 15 April 1771-2 Dec. 1848; Sarah, wife of Cador, died 22 May 1858, age 102 years.

By tying these articles in with dates, places, etc., one would assume Cador Gantt was possibly the son of, or related to Addison Gantt. Further research in Abbeville County would probably "tie" these families together.
