

The October meeting was held on Monday, Oct. 1, at the Coleman Recreation Center in Anderson. There were 37 members present along with eight guests, including guest speaker, Bob Cartee from Spartanburg.

1) - Abstracting of early newspapers.

2) - Printing of cemetery records - Carl Ellison has completed one volume of the records donated by Wayne Bratcher, but indexing, a major task, still has to be done.

3) - Courthouse records - Mrs. Lund reported that the records had been moved to the old Revco Building and that there would be an organizational meeting of volunteers held October 2, at 9 A.M.

Mary Szabo, chairperson for the nominating committee, reported the slate of officers for 1991. Members were again reminded that beginning in January we will begin meeting at the United Way Building on the corner of Murray Avenue and Greenville Street.

Bob Cartee, our guest speaker, gave a slide presentation and talk on the Old Wagon Road and other migratory routes from Pennsylvania and Virginia to North and South Carolina.

Seeking information on **Richard Gibson** who was listed in the 1800 census of Pendleton District. In 1794 he received a land grant on Eastatoe Creek, waters of Keowee River in what is now Pickens Co. He is believed to have lived in this county about 10 years.

Earliest record of Richard Gibson is with **George Gibson** in a purchase of 200 acres on Beaverdam Creek, a branch of Saluda River in Berkley Co. in 1772. Wit: by **Gilbert Gibson**.

Does anyone have church records that might tell the names of Richard's wife and children? Seems most of his children were born in Anderson Co., although in 1790 he had 2 daughters and a son. **Julius Gibson** lived near him on the Keowee River. There was also a **William** and a **John Gibson**. Would like to know the names of Richard's parents and where they came from. Were they Scotch-Irish? Any help or suggestions you can give me will be greatly appreciated.

CHAPTER BY-LAWS

Effective January 1991

1- MEETINGS

- A Meetings of the Chapter will be on the first Monday of each month, except July, August, and December, unless changed because of a holiday.
- B Meetings will be held in the United Way Building (old Social Security Office), 114 W. Greenville St., Anderson, S. C. 29622.

2 - CHAPTER BOARD

The Chapter Board shall consist of the elected officers, the Editor of the Chapter Newsletter, and the immediate past president. Former presidents may act as advisors.

3 - COMMITTEES

Committees are approved by the Chapter. The President shall appoint committee members, except the Nominations Committee, which shall be elected from the floor and shall be composed of at least three members. The President is an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominations Committee.

4 - CHAPTER DUES

Dues are for a calendar year:

- \$ 10.00 Individual Membership
- \$ 13.00 Family Membership
- \$ 5.00 Associate Membership

5 - EDITOR and OFFICIAL PUBLICATIONS

The editor of the Chapter Newsletter, upon recommendation by the Board, is elected by the Chapter annually.

The official periodical of the Chapter, "*The Anderson Record*", will be published quarterly, March, June, September, and December.


6 - REPRESENTATIVE ON THE STATE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
