Book Review: Tracing Your Civil War Ancestors

By: Bertram Hawthorne Groene - John F. Blain -- 119pp., \$11.95

Review states in part: This book is particularly indispensable to the novice genealogical researcher who, perhaps unfamiliar with historical scholarship, might find himself foundering in a sea of books, periodicals, libraries, private collections and government agencies with no clear quidelines of how to proceed with his search.

The book is geared specifically for the person trying to research a Civil War ancestor, but much of the information it contains would be just as helpful in tracing the military service of ancestors who served in the period from the Revolutionary War to World War I.

Most important, perhaps, is Dr. Groene's advice to the beginning researcher: Don't give up. He repeatedly urges researchers to send out record requests again and again, because of the disparity of training and interest in library and archive technicians. A second try may turn up information a previous researcher could not find.

While he concedes freely that records for tens of thousands of soldiers *are* impossible to trace (because they no longer exist or never did) — even those of his own great — grandfather— the conscientious person won't be satisfied with the apocryphal stories heard at grandma's knee. Family stories are wonderful, but tend to become exaggerated over the years so that privates become generals and cooks heroes.

Leonardo Andrea notes on Mauldin's states in part:

Henry Mauldin is said to have come to South Carolina or to Georgia Record is to be found of him in N.C. ... He is said to have married a Miss ______ Rucker. No will has been found for Henry Mauldin ... The names of all his children is not known. There is an early record of a Henry Mauldin in Laurens Co., S. C.... The only proved sons and children of Henry Mauldin are three sons: Rucker Mauldin, Balaamy Mauldin, and John Mauldin. Some students of Mauldin think that the following were also sons: Herod Mauldin, Laban Mauldin, Caleb Mauldin and Benjamin Mauldin. Relatives and perhaps grandsons or nephews of Henry Mauldin were the following men: Blake Mauldin, Joab Mauldin, Harris Mauldin, and John Mauldin. All these were residents of S. C. in 1790.

This letter is addressed to Mr. Stone c/o the Anderson Co. Library - dated 25 April 1990, and states

...... As I am not able to come to South Carolina, I am hoping you will be able to send me copies of any information you find. I am willing to pay for these copies of information. " My 4 great-grandfather was James Ashworth, Sr., bn. ca. 1771. The Ashworth are presumed to originate from Lanchestershire, England in 1774. They are supposed to have received a royal grant of 450 acres in Craven Co., S. C. from King George III." As I can find no Craven Co., in S. C., they are supposed to have lived in Pendleton, S. C. I know this will take some of your time, but I would deeply appreciate your help..... A list of my Ashworth ancestors:

...... James Ashworth, Sr., bn. ca., 1771 ... md. Keziah Dial their children are: Jesse, James, Jr., Mary, William, Moses, Aaron, and supposedly 5 more.

I am from: James Ashworth, Sr. and son, Moses Ashworth and son, Thompson Ashworth and son, Owen Ashworth. Any information you may find on the Ashworth is very important to me. I hope you will find the time in which to help me. Gratefully yours, and signed, Paula Ashworth Rose.

Editors note: A Craven Co., S. C. did exist as early as 1768 thru 1773 and probably earlier and later. Many land grants were made during this period. A check of the 1790 census should show this family. Let's see if we can help this lady.

General Genealogical Information

The following data has been compiled on this early Pendleton District, S. C. family. The 1800 Pendleton Dist. census listed three John Gresham's families. There were two John Gresham's and one John Gresham, Jr.. Two were most probably father and son and the other may or may not be related. I have not as yet determined which is buried in the Grisham family plot. This was a very notable family in the early history of Pendleton Dist. From 1791 thru 1795 John Gresham and John Gresham, Jr. both bought and sold land Little River of Savannah River and Twenty Six Mile Creek. They owned and operated an Iron Works company or factory on Twenty Six Mile Creek.
