

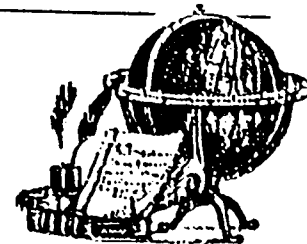

We will also discuss reading cemeteries and plan a couple of outings this summer to do just that. Don't miss the fun!

The following suspense story is continued from the last issue of *The Record*.

Six or seven years passed, in all of which time the sudden disappearance of John Wilson Meeks was put down as one of the unsolved mysteries of the troublous and disordered times just following the war. There was much bushwhacking then, and it was supposed that he was another victim of the bushwhackers, and no investigation was made. Very soon after Meeks disappearance, young Breazeale left the country, it was supposed to go to Texas. Davenport, who was a large farmer in the neighborhood, and who was comparatively a rich man, having in before the war days owned a number of slaves, lived quietly and as usual on his farm, enjoying the respect of his neighbors and making a good citizen as things went. The disappearance of Meeks had long since ceased to be interesting gossip, and as the suspicion had never hunted out the real murderers, it looked as if vengeance had passed them in its terrible sway over the ranks of the guilty.

The dream of peace and safety was rudely broken. One day about seven years after the murder, a message came from Bill Brock, the negro who had been the one disinterested witness of the killing to a brother of the murdered man. The negro was visited and revealed the whole story of the murder, detail by detail, declaring that it had haunted his mind until he could get no rest. He told of the shooting at the well and of the burial of the body in the blackness and ghostly silence of the forest, describing the exact location of the grave and telling the position of the body. Warrants were quickly sworn out for Vandiver, the preacher, and Davenport, the ones still in the country implicated by the negro's story. Vandiver got wind of the discovery and fled but was captured somewhere near the Georgia line. Davenport was the first captured, and when the officers approached the house he set a violent bull dog on them, which nearly killed one of the men. The pair were finally lodged in jail at Anderson.

The trial came on before Judge Orr. The principal witness was the negro Brock, who had turned State's evidence and escaped punishment thereby. The trial resulted in the conviction of both Davenport and Vandiver, and they were sentenced to be hanged. In neither case was the sentence executed. The aged ex-preacher died in jail before the day for the execution and the easy justice of Governor Moses released Davenport by an executive pardon, bought, it was said, at the expense of all his possessions. Davenport went back to his home near Belton and lived there for a number of years until he came here. He had acquired the morphine habit, it was said, before his imprisonment and trial and at the jail when visitors came in he would beg for money to buy the drug. After his release the deadly opiate drew him more and more into its slavery, and the soul of the murderer became the soul of the morally depraved opiate victim, dead and callous to every moral sense. His property drifted away, health and character were lost and misery accumulated on him.

## INTRODUCTION

This account describes, in part, (1) The genealogy of a line of Davis's in Anderson County, South Carolina which began with the arrival of William Davis from Virginia in 1799 and (2) the genealogy of a line of Davis's in Greenville County, South Carolina begun by George W. Davis in the 1840's. George W. is the key to establishing the relationship between the two lines.

Before getting into the particulars, though, mention should be made of a tremendous work, a Davis genealogy (Anderson County line) beginning with John Davis, a yeoman farmer in England and coming on down to the present, written by Mrs. Era Davis of Pickens, SC (1). The present writer would like to express his grateful appreciation to Mrs. Era Davis for her generosity in making available her work which is entitled,

"COUNTRY COUSINS  
DESCENDANTS OF JOHN DAVIS OF GLOUCESTER, ENGLAND  
AND VIRGINIA"

Mrs. Lucile Hammett of Honea Path, SC aided in this work by making valuable contributions from her extensive knowledge of our Davis ancestors.

## Part I. Anderson County Davis's

(Data is taken from "Country Cousins" unless otherwise noted)

WILLIAM DAVIS was born 26 Aug 1750 in Virginia where he married Nancy McCarley Wright. They lived in Spottsylvania County, Virginia until they came to South Carolina (before 1799) and settled in the Broadmouth Creek area of Abbeville County. He died there 31 Jan 1825. Their children were: William, McCarley (dau), Thomas, Joseph Henson, John L(ewis), Richard, Aaron and Moses (twins). It is John L. that we are concerned with at the moment.

JOHN LEWIS DAVIS was born abt 1790 in Virginia and undoubtedly came to South Carolina with his parents before 1799. He died in the Broadmouth Creek area of Anderson County abt 1863. He married Susannah "Susan" Wilson (b. abt 1782 in VA, d. abt 1860 in SC). John Lewis Davis was over 6 feet tall and stooped. They had to have a special coffin made for him.

Children of John Lewis Davis and Susan Wilson were:

1. WILEY DAVIS was born in 1812. His first marriage was to Levinia (sic) K. Cox, 4 Feb 1836. He went to Georgia sometime in 1846-54 and in Floyd County on 12 Apr 1855 married Sally Esters(sec) or Estin, no issue.

Children of Wiley Davis and Levinia (Lovinia) Cox were:

- a. James was born abt 1837 in SC.
  - b. William W. was born 9 Sep/Oct 1838 in SC.
  - c. John was born abt 1843 in SC.
  - d. Mary was born before 1845 in SC.
  - f. Hamilton was born abt 1845 in GA.
2. WILLIAM FRANKLIN DAVIS was born in 1814 and died on 9 Nov 1865. He was married on 7 Jan 1836 to Jane (Genie) Kay who was born in 1819. William Franklin was a Baptist minister.

Children of William Franklin Davis and Jane (Genie) Kay were:

- a. Wesley K. was born abt 1837 and died in the Civil War.
  - b. Sarah Elizabeth was born 9 May 1839.
  - c. Cynthia Ann was born 11 Jan 1845.
  - d. James Franklin was born in 1848.
  - e. Louise A. was born on 12 Dec 1850.
  - f. Mary Jane was born in 1855.
3. THOMAS WILSON DAVIS was born in 1818 and died on 2 Oct 1893. He was married on 18 Mar 1841 to Sally Kay (sister of Jane above).

Children of Thomas Wilson Davis and Sally Kay were:

- a. Sarah Ann was born abt 1843.
- b. Joel M. was born abt 1845 and died in the Civil War.
- c. George William Pleasant was born abt 1847.
- d. Frances Jane was born abt 1849.
- e. James K. Pope died as a small child.

- f. Dudley Strother died at age 21 from measles.
- g. John L. was born on 5 Mar 1851 and died on 26 Jan 1926.
- h. Mary married Tom Brown.

4. Joseph Henson Davis (called Henson) was born on 16 Oct 1819 in SC and died 19 Feb 1899 in the Ruhamah area near Liberty, SC. He married on 4 Feb 1841 Elizabeth "Betsy" Cummin(g)s who was born on 9 Jan 1818 in Abbeville County. Elizabeth "Betsy" Cummings died on 13 Aug 1876. Joseph Henson is buried at the Ruhamah Baptist Church, near the church in an unmarked grave.

Children of Joseph Henson Davis and Elizabeth Cummings were:

- a. Mary Jane was born on 13 Jan 1842.
  - b. Wiley was born on 17 Nov 1843.
  - c. Susan Annie was born 7 Jan 1848.
  - d. Lawrence Orr was born on 24 Jul 1850.
  - e. Ewell Euphratus "Dock" was born on 20 Jan 1853.
  - f. Cemantha Catherine "Kate" was born on 17 Feb 1855.
  - g. Infant son was born and died on 28 Jun 1857.
  - h. Demetrius H. "Met" was born on 6 Jun 1858.
  - i. Infant son, a twin to Demetrius, was born on 6 Jun 1858 and died 13 Aug 1858.
  - j. Joicy Savannah was born on 3 Nov 1859.
5. TURNER GABRIEL DAVIS was born 10 Nov 1820. He married, on 20 Mar 1845, Caroline Malinda Thayer Ellis who was born on 1 Nov 1821 and died on 30 Apr 1893. Turner Davis enlisted in the Confederate Army at Camp Pickens on 20 Jul 1861 and was discharged 5 Jan 1862. He enlisted again 7 Mar 1846, as a member of Orr's Rifles at Camp Orange. He was killed 12 May 1846 at Spottsylvania, Virginia (3).

Children of Turner Gabriel Davis and Carolina Malinda Ellis were:

- a. Elizabeth Susan was born 8 Mar 1846-48.
  - b. Asa Wilson was born on 22 Aug 1849.
  - c. Christopher Gabriel was born on 1 Mar 1851.
  - d. Mary Matilda was born 1 Mar 1853.
  - e. Amaziah P. Emmett was born on 28 Nov 1854.
  - f. Martha "Matttie" Morgan Samples was born on 29 Oct 1855.
  - g. Isalene was born on 29 Oct 1861.
  - h. William Hughes was born on 20 May 1862.
6. GEORGE W. DAVIS, according to the 1850 census (2), was born in 1823. Also, according to that report, in 1850 he was living in Anderson County with his parents and Frances Davis, born abt 1827. 1830 and 1840 census reports indicate that John L. had 6 sons and no daughters, so Frances is not a sister. In 1864, along with his brother Turner, George enlisted in the Confederate Army, joining Orr's Rifles in Virginia spending April 30th to Aug 31st in the hospital. He re-joined his unit on 1 Sept and was killed on 30 Sept in battle at Jones's farm near Petersburg, Virginia (3).

Children of George W. Davis and Frances Ragsdale were (4):

- a. John C. was born abt 1850.
- b. Berry Ithama was born on 27 May 1854, died 6 May 1933.
3. Chester C. was born 1857 and apparently died young.

Note: George's age has to be read carefully. It looks like at first that the second digit is a 9 (the census taker puts a curl on the flag of his 7's whereas on 9's the loop is closed. There is an obvious error in his age in the 1860 census where it is stated to be 28!

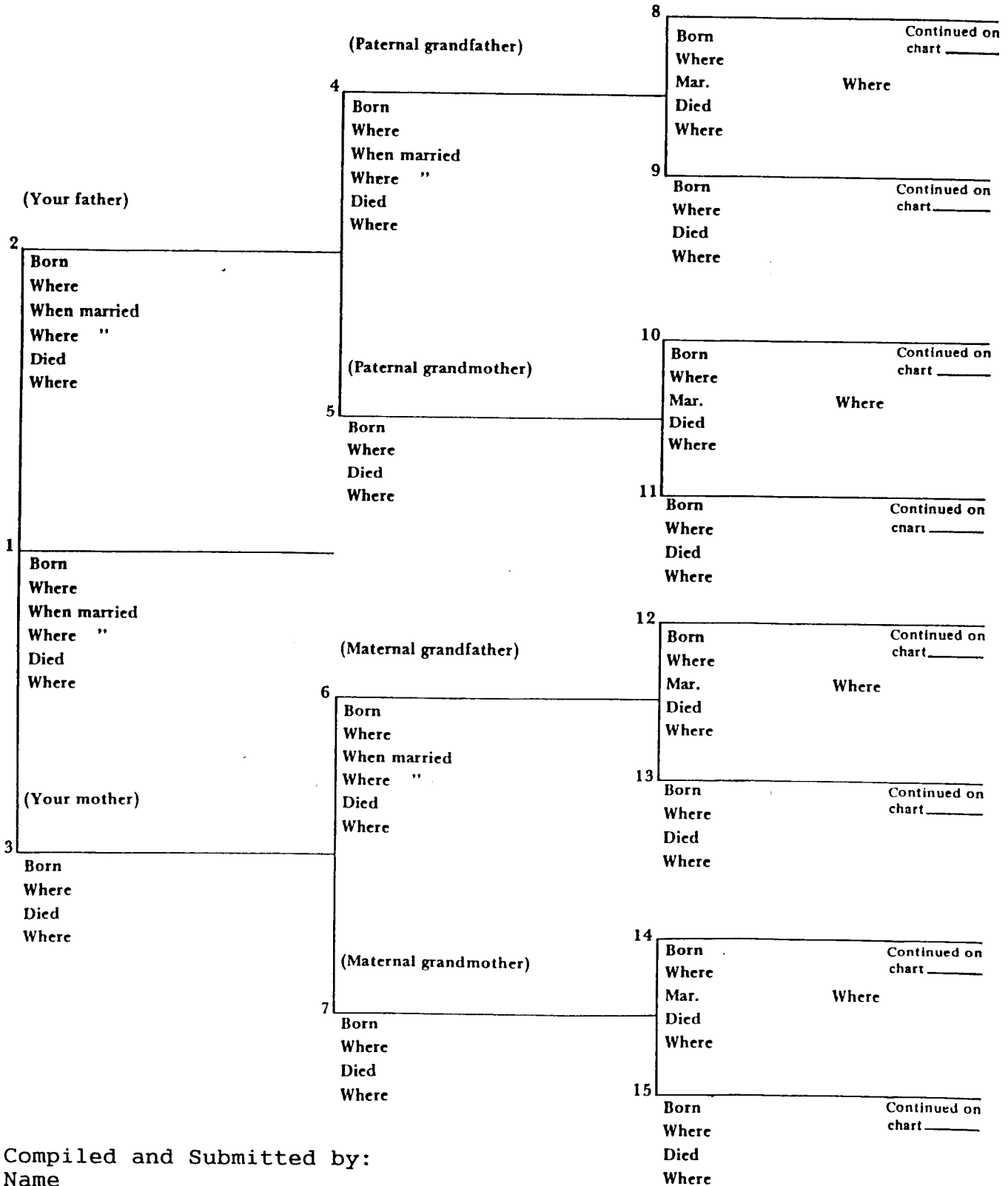
#### PEDIGREE OR LINEAGE CHARTS
