Nov.30,1799 birthdate listed by Irene Hendrix, in data from Martha Hendrix Hilborn of Baton Rouge, La. (rec'd.June 23,1993 by J.R.Hilliard, Jr.). Obit. in Southern Christian Advocate said he died in the 63rd year of his age. Obit. stated he was born in Anderson District, SC, It further stated, "Last June, although more that 60, he enlisted for the war with his son William, and went to Virginia as a private in Baldwin Co. Vol." "He was an exhorter and leader in the M.E.Church." Entered CSA at 62 yrs. age; died in the 63rd year of life. First CSA vet buried in Old Memory Hill Cemetery.

Obit. Feb.7,1862 issue SC Advocate -Cornelius suffered one attack of illness after another, and in addition was crushed beneath a loaded wagon, reluctantly accepted a discharge and came home to die. Becoming worse after having been discharged from hospital (Dec.1,1861) he with great difficulty reached Milledgeville but died 2 or 3 days later. His wife relapsed because of her forgetfulness of self and constant attention to him after arrival, a few days after his death she followed him to spirit world.

From the discharge record: Cornelius Hendrix, private, Company F, 9th Reg't Georgia Infantry, C.S.A., enlisted June 12, 1861, Milledgeville, Ga. by Benj. Back. June 30, 1862 [this can't be right as he died in 1861] sick at [sorry, page incomplete].

Excerpt from John Roy Hilliard, Jr. Hendrix Family Newsletter Dated August 30, 1989: In spite of time spent searching for Hendrix descendants and ancestors in the BaldwinCo., GA., courthouse in Milledgeville, in the South Carolina State Archives in Columbia, SC, in courthouses in Anderson, Lexington, and Newberry Counties, SC, we still haven't found a definite connection between the McComb ancestor Henry Hendrix and our ancestor Cornelius Hendrix. In Lexington, SC, Home of Henry Hendrix, we found that all the old records prior to 1873 had been transferred to the archives in Columbia for microfilming and storage. A large volume of information has been accumulated about many Hendrix families; however, the link to cinch the connection between Henry is still missing.

Excerpt from John Roy Hilliard, Jr. Hendrix Family Newsletter dated Sept. 15, 1991 regarding a trip he and his wife made to Georgia and South Carolina:

My search for Cornelius Hendrix parents in South Carolina still has not yielded proof of who are where they were. Census records place the both in Anderson Co., S.C.at time of Daniel Clary's birth in 1825 (1820-1825 for sure). We had already searched records in Anderson and Newberry; this trip we searched courthouse and library records in Lexington and Edgefield, SC, as well as the state archives in Columbia. There were lots of Hendrix (Hendricks alternate spelling also) then, as well as now. I copied about 30 names and addresses for Hendrix families in Lexington, S.C. alone, and will send each a form letter requesting information about a Cornelius relative born in 1792 or 1793. From Edgefield we traveled to Elberton, Georgia, to search courthouse records in this county seat of Elbert County where Cornelius and France Clary Hendrix lived for at least 14 years, and where 6 of their children were born. Our Daniel C. lived his boyhood and teen years in this area. I found no record of property owned by Cornelius in any of the court records. Cornelius' profession is listed in the 1850 Baldwin Co. census as carpenter; I assume he engaged successfully in this profession, built many homes and buildings, but owned no land or slaves. In the Georgia State Archives in Atlanta I did find tax records for Milledgeville, Baldwin Co., Ga. Cornelius was regulary listed each year paying taxes and the

only taxes owed and paid was a 25c poil tax. During two years (when D.C. was old enough) Daniel Clary also paid a 25c Poil tax in Milledgeville, and D.C.'s future father-in-law also paid only a 25c poil tax. Daniel Clary's occupation in 1850 was listed as school teacher. They lived in town, owned no land or slaves, were active members of the Methodist Church, and voted like good citizens.

Excerpt from John Roy Hilliard, Jr. Hendrix Family Newsletter dated March 20, 1992: TRAVELING AND SEARCHING BY JOHN AND JOYCE HILLIARD -

Joyce and I took advantage of my January 15th retirement to enroll in a Elderhostel Program at Georgia College, Milledgeville, Georgia, which lasted one week: February 6 through 23rd February, 1992. We did family history searching to and from and in Georgia. Joyce has family ancestors who left small traces of their life in Talbot County, Georgia...with a supposed ancestor, Henry Mims, who left Talbot Co. and moved to Alabama before her Mims ancestor moved to Lousiana. We searched for these Mims as well as our Hendrix family on the trip.

Milledgeville, Georgia, was the home of Cornelius Hendrix and his family beginning in the late 1840's. Cornelius Hendrix (father of Daniel Clary) is buried in the Old Memory Hill Cemetery in Milledgeville with our g-g-grandmother Frances Clary Hendrix and his second wife, Elizabeth Barnes Hendrix. Daniel Clary was a school teacher and Cornelius listed his profession as carpenter in the 1850 census. We had hoped to find more information about both, and did find out a little. The Georgia College library had on microfilm a complete collection of the two newspapers published in Milledgeville (capitol of Georgia) during the time they lived there. One was completely indexed, and the other was not. I found only one mention of importance. This was not new information, and did not expand upon what I had found in another book in Houston. This reported the marriage of Cornelius to Elizabeth Barnes on January 3, 1850. I had thought that the newspaper would flesh out announcements such as this that I had found in an abstract. To quote the SOUTHERN RECORDER of Milledgeville, Georgia: January 08, 1850. p. 3, "Married in this city on the 3d instant, by S. B. Brown, esq., Mr. Cornelius Hendrix to Mrs. Elizabeth Barnes."

Before leaving for Milledgeville we found the 16 Jan. 1851 date for Daniel Clary and Frances Jane Smith Hendrix's marriage. We hoped to locate the church where they were married and find old church records that would give family information. We also knew the name of the pastor, Rev. S.C. Daniel. Found no notice at all in the SOUTHERN RECORDER; the original notice we had found was in a Baptist Publication. In a book on the history of 1st Baptist Church of Milledgeville, found that Rev. S.C. Daniel was pastor there from 1851 to 1856. I called the church and talked to the church secretary and found that I could visit with the church librarian who would be there on Wednesday. In the course of the conversation I gave her my name, and the secretary excitedly asked me how I spelled my name... I told her, and she said her name is Hilliard also, and is spelled the same way. She then told me that her mother-in-law or possibly it was her husband's aunt has done a lot of genealogy on their line of Hilliards, and she would bring the information for me to look at that Wednesday. On Wednesday, I had the disappointment to find that the records at the church go back only to 1906; older records were destroyed by fires when the 1st Baptist Church burned on two dates...one in the 1880's and another in early 1900's. However, the Hilliard information was very complete and interesting. Mrs. Eileen Hilliard photocopied the 36 page document for me.

I did find a few additional bits of information about our family. In a letter to my mother one of her Georgia cousins had mentioned that Cornelius' son William Hendrix (brother of our Daniel Clary) had died young of disease contracted durin the Civil War. In the Georgia Military

College Library in Milledgeville I found the volume, ROSTER OF THE CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS OF GEORGIA 1881-1865. Vol. I. by Lillian Henderson. In this volume was more information about Company F, 9th Reg't., Georgia Volunteers, Infantry, Army of Northern VA, C.S.A. (Baldwin Co., Ga. Baldwin Co. Volunteers).

In addition to data already possessed about Cornelius, was the following: p. 1037. Hendrix, William D. - Private. June 12, 1861 (same unit, rank and enlistment date as his father, Cornelius, who was 68 in that date; William being 20 or 21.) Wounded at Campbell Station, Tenn. Nov. 16, 1863. Died of smallpox near Morristown, Tennessee Feb. 28, 1864.

The Hendrix family has never found the parents of Cornelius. I found a Hendrix Cornelius Who came from the Netherlands - Dallas Library has his son, Cornelius Hendrix. There is too much of a time span to connect them at this time.
