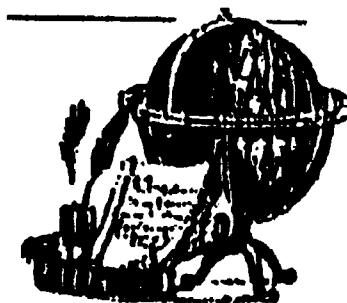

Seeking Information About These CONFEDERATE Soldiers

Of Anderson District, South Carolina



First Lieutenant Claudius E. Earle

Company B (Palmetto Riflemen)
4th South Carolina Volunteers (Infantry), C.S.A.
He died of disease at Richmond, Virginia, August 7, 1861.

William J. Jones (1826-1895) was a son of James V. Jones (1803-1860), who moved from Greenville County, S. C., to the Starr community of Anderson County, S. C., in the early 1800s. This Confederate soldier served as a first lieutenant in Co. I, Hampton Legion, C.S.A. His first wife was C. Elizabeth Dean (1828-1856); his second wife was Emily Adams (1821-1909). William J. Jones became the father of at least eight offspring by his two wives.

J. Martin Hanks served in Co. E, 20th South Carolina Regt., C.S.A. He attained the rank of corporal. In August 1914, he attended a reunion of his company at Neals Creek Ch. in Anderson County, South Carolina.

John R. Harper served as a corporal in Co. K, 1st S. C. Rifles (Orr's), C.S.A. He was wounded at Spotsylvania, Virginia during the war.

J. N. Barnett was a corporal in Co. E, 2nd S. C. Rifles (Moore's Regt.);

John Wesley Burdine joined for duty and enrolled as a private in Co. D, 4th S. C. Volunteers (Inf.), C.S.A. He was reported on his company's muster roll of December 31, 1861, as in general hospital.

David Rogers, Jr. (b. ca 1838 - d. 1864). He served as a private in Co. D (Gist Rifles), Hampton Legion, C.S.A. He was killed in action at Dandridge on January 17, 1864.

John Wesley Poor served as a private, corporal, sergeant and lieutenant in Co. G, 2nd S. C. Rifles (Moore's), C.S.A. He survived the war, and on February 23, 1868, he married Corrie P. Cox, youngest daughter of Abner Cox, Sr. of Anderson County, S. C.

J. J. Kitsinger served as a private in Co. D (Gist Rifles), Hampton Legion, S.C.V., C.S.A. (Is this soldier A. J. Kitsinger who was wounded during the First Battle of Bull Run at Manassas, Virginia?)

Joseph Allen Laboon (1840-1906) served as a private in Co. C, 4th S.C. Volunteers, C.S.A., and as a corporal in Co. B, 37th Virginia Cavalry, C.S.A. He enlisted in the Virginia cavalry on June 10, 1863, at Richmond, Virginia. He was buried at Fairview Methodist Church near the Anderson-Pickens line.

Samuel H. Langston (1823-1878) was a sergeant in Co. B (Palmetto Riflemen), 4th S.C. Volunteers (Inf.). He enlisted at Anderson, S.C., on 14 Apr 1861, and was discharged from the C.S.A. during the Civil War. His wife was Lucy J. Langston (1831-1918). They were buried at Anderson First Presbyterian Church in Anderson, South Carolina.

W. N. Langston (d. 1863) was killed in action on October 29, 1863, at Lookout Valley, Tennessee. He was a member of Co. B (Palmetto Riflemen), 4th S.C. Volunteers (Inf.).

Francis (or Frances) Marion Mullikin (1842-1864) was killed during the Battle of the Crater at Petersburg, Virginia. He was a son of Benjamin Mullikin, Jr. (1805-1855) and Sarah Jane "Jennie" Smith Mullikin (b. 2 Jul 1813). Six of this soldier's brothers also served in the C.S.A. during the Civil War.

Emanuel K. Mullinax (d. 1864) was killed in action on May 31, 1864, while serving in Co. I, Palmetto Sharpshooters. He was a son of William G. Mullinax (1805-1860) and Philadelphia (Gaines) Mullinax. During the war, this soldier replaced Thomas Herbert Williams as a third lieutenant in his company. Later, Mullinax was promoted to second lieutenant.

Levi Burress (or Burris) served as a

private in Co. C, 1st S. C. State Troops. He was buried at Mountain Creek Baptist Church in Anderson Co., S.C. (Was this L. J. Burriss, who married Mrs. M. E. Blanton of Forsyth County, Georgia, on July 18, 1875?)

Lewis E. Campbell served as a corporal in Co. E, 2nd S.C. Rifles (Moore's Regiment), C.S.A. When he first attempted to enlist in the army, Campbell was rejected because he was considered to be too small. Later during the Civil War, he was allowed to enlist.

Thomas F. Gadsden (1839-1891) served in the C.S.A. His wife was Mary Trapier Gadsden (1849-1909), daughter of Paul Trapier and Sarah Russell Dehon Trapier. This soldier was buried at the First Presbyterian Church in Anderson, South Carolina.

Benjamin Sloan Gaillard (1849-1910) was an Arsenal cadet during the war.

Isham Taylor served to the rank of sgt. in Co. E, 20th S.C. Infantry, C.S.A.

Robinson Warren Shelor (1844-1908). Is this soldier W. R. Shelor who served in Co. G, 7th South Carolina Cavalry? Robinson Warren Shelor was buried in Old Silverbrook Cemetery in Anderson, South Carolina.

William M. Shirley (d. 1862) was killed in action on May 31, 1862, during the Battle of Seven Pines in Virginia. He served in both Co. J, 4th S.C. Volunteers (Inf.) and in Co. L, Palmetto Sharpshooters, C.S.A.

Henry Strother Shumate (1846-1935) was buried in Old Silverbrook Cemetery in Anderson, S.C. On 7 Oct 1869, he married Miss J. Smith, daughter of Joel Smith of Laurens County, S.C.

James Milton Welborn (1819-1898) was a captain in Butler's Regiment (Inf.), Rhett's Brigade, C.S.A. His wife was Mary Henderson Irby Welborn (1824-1900). They were buried at Six and Twenty Baptist Church in Anderson Co.

John T. Webb (d. 1862) served as a private in Co. B, 4th S.C. Volunteers (Sloan's Regiment), C.S.A. He was mortally wounded during the Battle of Seven Pines in Virginia on May 31, 1862.

R. S. Smith enrolled as a private in Co. I, Palmetto Sharpshooters on March 15, 1862, at Pickens Court House on the Keowee River. He was captured by Union troops during the war and was released as a prisoner of war on June 26, 1865. (Is this Reuben Smith who also served in Co. I, Palmetto Sharpshooters during the Civil War?)

George W. Richardson resided in the Williamston area of Anderson District, S.C. He served as a Confederate soldier during the Civil War.

James Robert Richey (1844-1862) served as a private in the C.S.A. He was a son of James N. Richey and Lucinda (Hunt) Richey and a brother of Harvey Alonzo Richey, C.S.A.

James Lawrence Dean (1847-1919) was an Arsenal cadet who fought in the Civil War. He was a native of Anderson District, S. C., and after the war was a grover in Spartanburg and Greenville, S.C.

Robert Baylis Dean (1837-1905) was a member of Company C, 4th South Car Volunteers. His company was commanded by Capt. John Thomas Dean. He also served as a corpora in Co. E, 13th Battalion Infantry. His wife was Amanda (Burriss) Dean (1840-1844). This Confederate veteran was drowned in a Florida lake while on a fishing trip. He was 67 years of age at death.

John Edward Hembree (1843-1906) was a member of Co. K, Hampton Legion. He had served earlier in Co. D, 4th S. C. Infantry Volunteers.



Lt. William Poe was mortally wounded Oct. 29, 1863, in Lookout Valley, Tenn. He served in Co. B (Palmetto Riflemen), 4th S.C. Volunteers, in which he was a corporal. He also served to the rank of 1st lieutenant in Co. C, Palmetto Sharpshooters, C.S.A.

CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS OF ANDERSON DISTRICT, SOUTH CAROLINA

Samuel Agnew served as a sergeant in Co. E, 2nd S.C. Rifles (Moore's).

James P. Alexander (1842-1862) was a private in Co. K, 1st S.C. Rifles (Orr's Regt.), C.S.A. He enlisted July 20, 1861, and was wounded at the Battle of Gaines' Mill, VA, on June 27, 1862 (shot in knee and his hip). He died July 10, 1862, at Chimborazo #3 Hospital at Richmond, Virginia.

Thomas Jefferson Bratcher enlisted in Co. D, 4th S.C. Volunteers at Anderson, S.C. on April 14, 1861. He later served in Co. L, Palmetto Sharpshooters, and his disposition is unknown.

William J. Brown served to the rank of first lieutenant in the C.S.A. He was a member of Co. J, 4th S.C. Volunteers (Sloan's Regt.) and resigned in June 1861.

J. B. Jennings, a Confederate vet., was buried in Williamston Cemetery in Anderson County, South Carolina.

William Gaillard Jenkins served in Co. B, 4th S.C. Volunteers and in Co. C, Palmetto Sharpshooters. He was wounded in action during the war and received a medical discharge from the C.S.A. He was probably a resident of Pendleton, South Carolina.

B. L. Johnson, a Confederate soldier, was a resident of the Williamston area of Anderson County, S. C.

Edward M. Johnson served as a fifth sergeant in Co. K, 2nd S. C. Rifles (Moore's Regt.), C.S.A. He died of wounds at Campbell Station, Tenn.

J. Warren P. Johnson (d. 1864) died of disease on March 10, 1864, at Bristol while serving in Co. K, 2nd S.C. Rifles (Moore's Regiment), C.S.A.

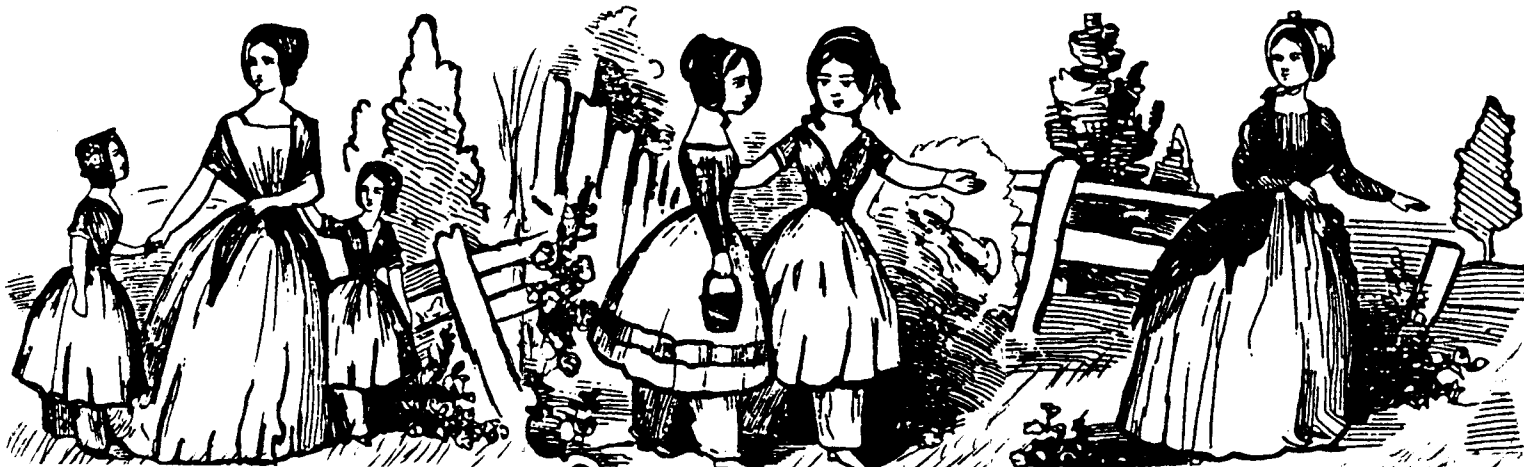
Marcus Lafayette Mullikin was born in about 1836, a son of James Mullikin (1794-1888) and Melinda Norton Mullikin (1799-1889) of Anderson Dist., S.C. He served in the C.S.A.

James M. Nimmons (1847-1926), a Confederate veteran, was buried in Old Silverbrook Cemetery in Anderson, S.C. His wife was Phalby (Lewis) Nimmons (1847-1925).

W. A. Nichols served as a private in Co. C, 1st S.C. State Troops.

Larkin Nix was a private in Co. F, 24th S.C. Volunteers (Inf.), C.S.A.

Jesse W. Norris (1817-1899), a veteran of the Civil War, married his second wife, Miss Susan Simpson, on January 16, 1867. His first wife was Anna Louise (Lesley) Norris (1828-1859). This Confederate soldier rose to the rank of sergeant major. Before the Civil War, he attended the University of Virginia and was a roommate of James L. Orr, who became the first commander of the 1st S.C. Rifles (Orr's Regt.), C.S.A. Jesse W. Norris served two terms in the S.C. Legislature prior to the Civil War.

Lewis Malone Ayer (1821-1895), a Confederate soldier during the Civil War. He was buried in Old Silverbrook Cemetery in Anderson, S. C. He was laid to rest beside the grave of Louise Ayer Vandiver (1865-1938). (Was this soldier the father of Louise Ayer Vandiver?)

A. A. Bowie served as a private in Co. C, 1st S. C. State Troops.

Benjamin F. Bowie (1848-1923) was a Confederate soldier who was buried in Old Silverbrook Cemetery in Anderson, South Carolina.

W. J. Moore served as a sergeant in Co. D, 18th S. C. Regiment, C.S.A.

John Henry Morgan entered the army at age sixteen and served as a private

in Co. H, 1st S. C. State Troops. After the Civil War. He married Lucy Ann Craft (1850-1915), who was a daughter of John Marion Craft Nancy Permelia Gaines Craft.

Thomas Morgan (1817-1871) served in Co. I, 1st S.C. State Troops from August 1863 until February 1864. His company commander was Captain John W. Hearst.

John Tyler Moushet (1838-1911) joined for duty and enrolled as a private in Co. C, 4th S.C. Volunteers (Inf.) at Anderson, S. C., on April 14, 1861. His wife was Frances Louise Mouchet (1846-1919), and they were buried at New Hope Presbyterian Ch. in Anderson County, South Carolina.

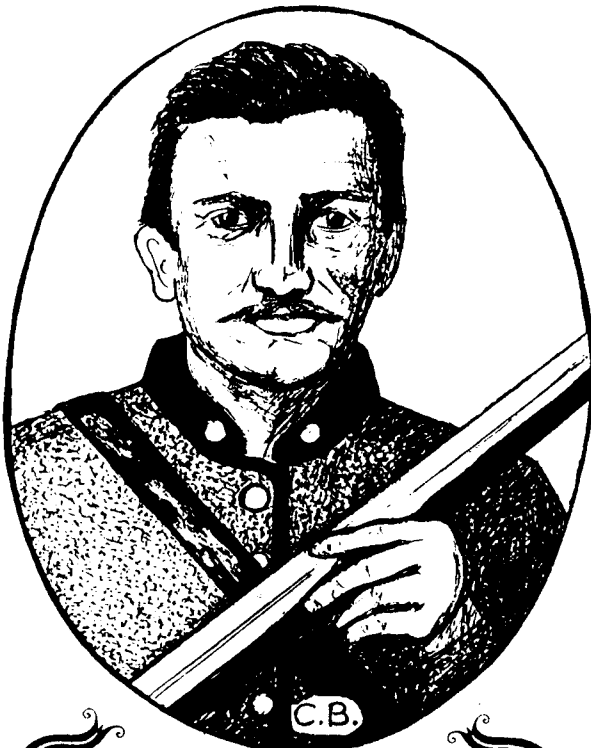
Thomas Carson Orr (1841-1927) was the recipient of a Civil War pension in Oconee County, S. C., in 1902. He was a son of Alexander Orr and Malinda Couch Orr. His wife was Telitha (Tabitha) Catherine (Orr) Orr (1843-1927), daughter of Wm. Orr and Nancy (Clardy) Orr of Anderson District, South Carolina.

Matthew Parker was wounded in action on May 14, 1863, during a battle at Jackson, Mississippi. He was a private in Co. F, 24th S.C. Volunteers (Inf.), C.S.A.

J. H. Reed served in Co. G, 2nd Bn. S.C. Reserves, commanded by Capt. John C. Martin. On August 5, 1910, he attended a reunion of the so-called "boy vets" at Anderson, S.C.

John H. Reeves was a member of Co. C, 4th S.C. Cavalry, C.S.A. He was buried at Mountain Springs Baptist Church in Anderson County, S. C., but no dates appear on his tombstone.

Addison Emmet Rice enlisted in Co. C, 4th S.C. Volunteers (Sloan's Regt.) at Anderson, S.C., on April 14, 1861. He was mustered into Confederate service at Columbia, S.C., on June 7, 1861. He was a fourth sergeant in the company.

Lt. John Calhoun Clemson (1841-71)
Co. H, 1st S.C. Artillery, C.S.A.
He was a son of Thomas Green Clemson (1807-1888), the founder of Clemson University, and Anna Maria (Calhoun) Clemson (1817-1876).

S.C. Volunteers (Inf.), C.S.A. He was wounded during the war. He also served as a private in Co. C, Palmetto Sharpshooters, C.S.A., and was paroled at Appomattox Court House in Virginia.

F. A. Deale served as a lieutenant in Co. E, 2nd S.C. Rifles (Moore's).

Junius J. Neville (1837-1907) served in the C.S.A. His wife was Jane M. Neville (1841-1908), and they were buried in Old Silverbrook Cemetery, Anderson, South Carolina.

Peter Keys McCully (1845-1917) served as a 2nd class Citadel cadet during the Civil War. He married Maggie J. Cathcart of Columbia, S.C. on November 12, 1867. He was once a cotton buyer in Anderson, S.C.

A. Henry Kohler served as a 4th corporal in Co. D (Gist Rifles), Hampton Legion, S.C.V., C.S.A.

Major Lewis Keys (1842-1911) served as a lieutenant in the C.S.A. He was wounded at Second Manassas. His wife was Mary (Roberts) Keys. They were married on December 15, 1889.

S. A. Hutchinson (1830-1906) was a member of Co. F, 24th S.C. Volunteers (Inf.), C.S.A. He was promoted to corporal but was discharged by substitute in October 1862. His wife was Mary E. Hutchingon (1831-1875), and they were buried at Good Hope Presbyterian Church in Anderson Co.

John S. Hyde (1845-1942) was a member of Co. F, 1st S.C. Cavalry, C.S.A. He died on April 29, 1942, and was buried in Old Silverbrook Cemetery in Anderson, South Carolina.

David Ingraham was discharged from the C.S.A. in February 1862 because of disability from the effects of a gunshot wound. He served in Co. D, 4th S.C. Volunteers (Sloan's Regiment).

William Obediah Campbell was a member of Co. E, 24th S. C. Infantry, C.S.A. He was buried at Generostee ARP Church at Iva in Anderson Co., SC.

James Robinson served as a corporal in Co. K, 1st S. C. Rifles (Orr's Regt.) (Is this James K. Robinson (16 Nov 1842 - 24 Apr 1900), who was buried at Carmel Presbyterian Church in Pickens County, South Carolina?)

Larkin Rodgers (or Rogers) served as a private in Co. C, 1st S.C. State Troops from Anderson District, SC.

W. P. Roebaek was a private in Co. D (Gist Rifles), Hampton Legion, SCV, C.S.A. He was wounded during the First Battle of Bull Run at Manassas.

David Crawford served as a private in Co. C, 1st S.C. State Troops.

James Danley Crawford enlisted 14 Apr 1861 at Anderson, S. C., and served in Co. B (Palmetto Riflemen), 4th
