### The Story Teller .. We are The Chosen

My feelings are that in each family there is one who seems called to find the ancestors. To put flesh on their bones and make them live again, to tell the family story and to feel that somehow they know and approve. To me, doing genealogy is not cold gathering of facts but, instead, breathing life into all who have gone before.

We are the storytellers of the tribe. All tribes have one. We have been called as it were by our genes, Those who have gone before cry out to us: Tell our story. So we do. In finding them, we somehow find ourselves.

How many graves have I stood before now and cried? I have lost count. How many times have I told the ancestors you have a wonderful family you would be proud of us? How many times have I walked up to a grave and felt somehow there was love there for me? I cannot say. It goes beyond just documenting facts. It goes to who I am and why do I do the things I do? It goes to seeing a cemetery about to be lost forever to weeds and indifference and sharing, I can't let this happen. The bones here are bones of my bone and flesh of my flesh. It goes to doing something about it. It goes to pride in what our ancestors were able to accomplish. How they contributed to what we are today. It goes to respecting their hardships and losses, their never giving in or giving up, their resoluteness to go on and build a life for their family. It goes to deep and immense understanding that they were doing it for us. That we might be born who we are. That we might remember them. So we do.

With love and caring and scribing each fact of their existence, because we are them and they are us. So, as a scribe called, I tell the story of my family. It is up to that one called in the next generation to answer the call and take their place in the long line of family storytellers. That, is why I do my family genealogy, and that is what calls those young and old to step up and put flesh on the bones.

## Johnson preserves history in Louisiana

Geismar, LA, site employee Mardus 'Myrtis' Johnson is leading an effort to preserve history by working with a group to save the old cemeteries in Louisiana in the 'Save Our Graves Foundation.'

"We are already committed to locating, cleaning and restoring all abandoned cemeteries in St. Helena Parish," says Johnson. "We're starting here, because this is where we're from, but we would like to see our efforts grow to include every lost cemetery in the state."

Johnson is a genealogy buff and has spent the better part of two years putting the project together. Her passion for the preservation efforts came when she tried to visit a cemetery where some of her ancestors were buried.

"It was terribly overgrown,"

she recalls, "and many of the markers had been damaged." Wanting to make a difference, Johnson decided to recruit people to help 'Save our Graves.'

"We work with hunting clubs to find old cemeteries," she says. "Their members have stumbled over sites we don't even know about. An archeologist is helping us compile databases with maps, and we found a company that does thermal imaging to help us map out the graves."

The technology proved its value the very first day, detecting more than 70 graves in one cemetery when it first seemed there were only several. "When they turned on the imaging, it was amazing," says Johnson. "All of the sudden there was a whole cemetery with rows laid out just like you would expect. It was awesome." ■
