The following is an interesting account written by a member of a research group that your editor is associated with on the internet. Her name is Cindy Shipman. I am sure that some of you have run into similar situations while doing your research.

“This headstone thing drives my student researchers crazy! (Keep in mind they are just little kids but now have experienced transcribing four cemeteries and looking for all the obituaries.)

We've found - -spouses buried with their first mate with either surname on the stone; -spouses buried with parents without their married name; double headstones with one plot vacant (though most certainly dead); women buried next to their husbands but with their maiden name on the stones; -spouses buried next to their last spouse but with information about previous spouse(s); -an elderly brother and sister buried under a double headstone (which gave the impression they were a married couple--only their obits told us otherwise); -recently placed stones marking a series of still births from the 1910's that all say "infant son of..." - when we found the courthouse records they were two boys and one girl; -people buried in plots with stones that say things like "Aunt Claude" no surname! or "Our Son" Horace (Horace died when he was 58!) with no surname! .. BUT THE WINNER IS - one woman who is listed by her maiden name and then it says wife of XXXXXXXXXXXX, XXXXXXXXXXXX, and XXXXXXXXXXXX. None of those husbands are buried near her. AND the runner up is - a man and his two wives buried on either side of him BUT when the cemetery was first recorded thirty years ago, a double stone rested over him and his first wife. When his second wife died, the original double stone was removed and a new double stone was erected over them and a single stone was placed over the first wife. We've seen another resolution to this problem - a man and his two wives resting under a triple headstone. We suspect this second family had less conflict about the second marriage.

Oh, I forgot...we'll have to call this one the GRAND PRIZE WINNER. Our community was founded by a group of Civil War vets from Arkansas. The Copeland family donated the land for the cemetery and when the old soldier died, a nice headstone was placed there. Many members of the family passed away in the next few years, and their graves are clustered together. When Mrs. Copeland died, a nice double stone was placed on her grave. When my students went to transcribe the cemetery we found THREE markers for the old soldier John Copeland; the old marker (perhaps three rows and three plots away from the others), the large double marker, and a veterans administration marker for his war service (at the foot of the plot with the double marker.) Well, this one sent us over the edge. Was Mr. Copeland buried under the old stone or the new one? I finally got a chance to ask and this is the answer (who would have guessed?) When Mrs. John Copeland died the family ordered the large double stone and then they had this "extra" marker. One of Mr. Copeland's grandsons was in an unmarked grave (he had been attacked and thrown off a moving train near Fort Worth about 1910) so the family had the marker erected on his grave WITHOUT CHANGING THE INSCRIPTION. I never could figure out why the grandson's grave wasn't marked (we had found the train story and knew he was reported buried here) - his older brother died just a few years previous and he had a marker and many years later his mother died and she has a marker -- which leaves us with why didn't they mark his grave to begin with? My kids have come to a new understanding about headstones - they are hunks of rocks that people have prepared for other people -- they are not the Commandments that were given to Moses.”

Anderson County's Mulberry Creek located between Governors and Wilsons Creeks

Summary

Mulberry Creek was identified in five SC plats and two Anderson Co. deeds dated 1785–1833. Research based upon these documents confirmed Mulberry Creek's origin about 0.32 mile ESE of Carswell Church, located at the intersection of Highways 49 and 413, and its discharge about 2.6 miles southeastward into Rocky River, at a point now beneath Secession Lake and just N of the west footing of Hwy. 184's bridge across the lake.

Place names become lost as time passes. Mulberry Creek, waters of Rocky River, Ninety-Six District (now Anderson Co., SC), was such a lost name.

Research into the lands owned by the Callaham and Dobbins families—pioneers in what then was Pendleton District of Ninety-Six District—repeatedly disclosed the names of Rocky Creek/River, and of Beaver, Governors, and Tugaloo Creeks. These watercourses, being named on maps, were easily compared with the watercourses named and mapped on plats and deeds obtained from microfilms at SC Archives and History, Columbia, SC.

Serious questions arose when five plats were found showing a watercourse labeled "Mulberry Creek" No one familiar with Anderson County lands and records even recognized the name of this creek, let alone knew its location. That is, no one until Louis Cochran recalled:

"This creek has to be between Wilsons Creek and Governors Creek, and is not named on later maps. Alex Erwin (Irwin) and Susannah his wife bought and sold land around First Creek and Rocky River. Some plats of this land later named Mulberry as a water course. Mulberry would be on the west side of Rocky River, and First Creek is on the east."

Thus, he postulated that Mulberry Creek was the mapped, but unnamed, water course flowing about 2.6 miles southeastward and entering Rocky River about one mile below where First Creek enters Rocky River from the east. The test of this postulate was to determine whether the water courses labeled "Mulberry Creek" on the five plats coincided with the twisting and branching shown on the U. S. Geological Survey "Antreville" Quadrangle.

Each plat was reduced in size so actual lengths of its tract boundaries fit the scale of the USGS quad. Remember: 80 chains equals one mile. A blue pen was used to highlight water courses, and another color was used to highlight roads and trails. Adhesive was applied to the back of each plat with a glue stick. Then the plats were positioned so their watercourses and roads coincided with those on the quad. Within five minutes we had our confirmation. Mulberry Creek was that unnamed water course on the USGS "Antreville" quad.

Among the five plats studied, plat 6:96 was the earliest to name Mulberry Creek. That tract of 425 acres, having been certified 26 Apr 1785 for James Coil, obviously had been surveyed earlier. On that plat "Mulberry Creek" was penned next to the N branch of a forked run that flowed southwesterly into "Rocky Creek". In agreement with the USGS quad, this plat clearly showed the first branch of Mulberry Creek above its confluence with Rocky River. The confluence was mapped approximately 20 chains below where Rocky Creek sharply changed direction of flow from SSW to SE.

Plat 42:231, 8 Feb 1810, for a tract directly opposite on the E bank of Rocky River, showed the confluence of "Mulberry Creek" with "Rocky River" at a point near where Rocky River sharply changed direction of flow from SSW to E. This confirmed the previously described plat and proved that Mulberry Creek entered Rocky River at a point now covered by Secession Lake.

Plat 23:301 was for a tract of 170 acres that had been surveyed 27 Apr 1785 for Thos. Coil but had been certified later (23 Aug 1788) for Jas. Maxwell "on the head of Mulberry Creek". This plat clearly showed that Mulberry Creek originated on a tract to the north (see next paragraph) and flowed S and SW across this tract and exited the E boundary into a tract of "land laid off for Martha

Coil." On 22 Aug 1816, Maxwell's tract of land was owned by John McMahan (see below, deed M:582). By 1833 this tract was owned by Wm. Taylor (see below, plat 50:276).

Plat 25:347, surveyed 15 or 16 Mar 1786 for John McCullough (McCullough), contained 200 acres. It straddled and confirmed the location of the most northern headwater of Mulberry Creek. This narrow hatchet-shaped, ridge-top tract measured E-W abt 93 ch. (= 1.16 mi.), and N-S from an eastern minimum of 6.8 ch. (= 0.085 mi.) to a western maximum of 46.4 ch. (= 0.58 mi.). A fork of Mulberry Creek originated in the middle of the tract and, flowing S, crossed the south boundary to enter "Martha Coyls (Coil's) land." A later map of the tract (see below, plat 50:276) showed the road "to Basking ford" (now Hwy. 49) crossing the tract NW-SE about 1/3 mi. E of the headwater of Mulberry Creek.

Plat 25:347 in 1786 did not show any roads crossing the tract. Apparently the roads to Lee's Shoal and to Basking ford did not exist at that time. The earliest mention of the road to Lee's Shoal was found in 1816 (see below, deed M:851). The earliest mention of the road to Basking ford was in 1833 (see below, plat 50:276)

On 7 Mar 1798 McCullough sold for 50 Pounds a 200-acre tract "on the head branches of Mulberry Creek" to John Callaham (Sr.), Anderson Co. Deed E:104. This deed lacked a plat. The facts that the deed was for the identical area, "200 acres", and repeated the identical wording, "on head branches of Mulberry Creek", lead to the conclusion that plat 25:347 pertained to the tract in deed E:104.

The plat in deed M:581, surveyed 20 Apr 1816, showed the sources of both Mulberry and Governors Creeks and confirmed their close proximity. Governors Creek flowed W. The source of southward flowing Mulberry Creek was measured as approximately 27 ch., = 0.33 mi., S of the source of Governors Creek. The "road to Lee's Shole", now Hwy. 413 was shown crossing the tract W-E just north of the source of Mulberry Creek.

By 1798 John Callaham Sr. owned the two adjoining tracts that included the headwaters of Mulberry Creek and a fork of Governors Creek. Those tracts, approximating 400 acres, were shaped like an inverted "T".

The northern tract that included the springs feeding Governors Creek, had a NNW-SSE length of 0.87 mile. Its W boundary either was adjacent to or included the road "to Basking ford", now Hwy. 49.

The southern tract had a base length of approximately 1.16 mile. What was then called "road to Lees Shole", now Hwy. 413, was more or less the E-W center line of this elongated tract. About one-quarter of the distance from the W to the E boundary, a road to "Basking ford" (now Hwy. 49) crossed the tract NW-SE. This crossing now is the intersection of Highways 49 and 413. It is about 35 ch. (0.44 mi.) WNW of the confluence of the two springs that are the sources of Mulberry Creek.

Southeast from that intersection about 8 ch. (0.1 mi.) along the road to Basking ford was the S boundary of this tract. The point where the road crossed the tract's boundary in turn was about 30 ch. (0.37 mi.) WNW of Mulberry Creek.

At the SE corner of that intersection one now finds Carswell Church, other buildings, and a cemetery. Another cemetery is located across the road, N of Hwy. 413.

John Callaham, Sr., and his wife, Mary, lived on these lands for 30-40 years, until 1820 or later. Dates and places of their deaths and burials are unknown. They were not buried in the two cemeteries on Hwy. 413

Plat 50:276 was certified to John Hall, 27 Nov 1833, from a survey dated ? August 1833. That plat was for a 232-acre tract that was the base of John Callaham's inverted "T". It was described as "on the Road leading from Lee's Shoals on Rocky River to Shockley's Ferry on Savannah River (now SC Hwy. 413) on the Head Branches of Mulberry Creek and of Wilsons Creek.". Apparently John Callaham, Sr., or executors of his estate, or some intermediary owner had sold this tract to John Hall.

These five plats confirmed both Mulberry Creek's origin, about 0.32 mile ESE of Carswell Church at the intersection of Highways 49 and 413, and its discharge into Rocky River at a point now beneath Secession Lake and just N of the west footing of Hwy. 184's bridge across the lake.

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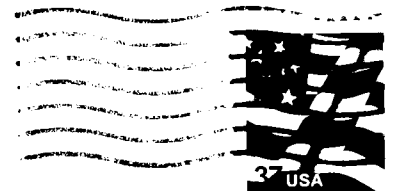
