The Anderson County chapter of the South Carolina Genealogical Society met on Monday, June 7, at Good Hope Presbyterian Church in Iva, with 26 members and guests present. The meeting was called to order by the president, Juanita Garrison. Margaret Cole introduced her husband, Bill, and Jenny Gentry introduced her husband, Keys. Jean Martin introduced Good Hope members Larry and Rita McMullan and their daughter, Elizabeth, a student at Erskine College. The devotional was led by chaplain Lamar Gamble. Ron Kay, treasurer, reported a balance of \$15,027.19 and a current paid membership of 93. Linda Cushing reported that the newsletter's article about Willington was picked up by one of the state society's newsletters. Sue Brewer reported that the digital camera has been purchased. The cost was \$599 for the camera. But, additional accessories are needed. New Business: The SCGS meeting-workshop will be held in July. Our chapter has paid \$15-20 toward a reception there. The Family History Room at the Mormon Church needs a reader (microfilm or microfiche). After discussion, Sue Brewer suggested that a committee check into the need. Phil Cheney reported that Young Memorial A.R.P. Church has an updated list of members. The church is 100 years old.

Jean Martin introduced the speaker, Dr. Lowry Ware, retired Erskine College History professor, co-author of the History of Good Hope Church, and a classmate of hers at Erskine. Dr. Ware retired in 1987 and has also written a book about Abbeville and one about Due West. Good Hope Church was founded in 1789, thus is 215 years old. Lowry's great-grandfather, Peniel Price, was an elder in the church. Its founder, Reverend John Simpson, was prominent in the Revolutionary War. He came to the area because of John Moffatt, for whom Moffattsville was named. Church information can be acquired from the SC Archives and the Historical Foundation at Montreat, NC. The Brown's Ferry incident occurred in this area. Dr. Ware answered questions from members of the group at the conclusion of his talk. The meeting was adjourned until October.

My Dorsey ancestors began with Thomas Dorsey (1620's) who was transported to VA to build ships that would sail to England for Thomas Brown. Thomas Brown's granddaughter, Eleanor Brown married Richard Warfield of Maryland. Their descendants included famous Governor Warfield and Wallis Warfield Simpson who married Edward VIII, the ex-king of England. John Dorsey, b. 1643, and his brother, Edward, Jr. were leaders in the Maryland Assembly. They got the Capital moved to Annapolis. The house built by their father, Edward Dorsey, Sr., was used as the Capitol building.

Richard Lynch descended from the "hated landlords of Galway." In the book, Baltimore Co., MD Deeds, V.1, 1659-1737 by John Davis, p. 300, a deposition of John Bevans, dated 19 Nov 1723, appointed Marcos Lynch guardian of Roebuck Lynch (b. 1865) after the death of Richard Lynch. Marcos Lynch, a merchant of Baltimore, brought Roebuck Lynch to Baltimore prior to 1675. More of Ms. Watkins' ancestry was printed in Fall, 2004, Old Newberry District Quarterly.

You lived as a child in the 60s or the 70s. (Some of us in the 40s and 50s.)

Looking back, it's hard to believe that we have lived as long as we have. As children, we would ride in cars with no seat belts or air bags. Riding in the back of a pickup truck on a warm day was always a special treat.

Our baby cribs were covered with bright colored lead-based paint. We had no child proof lids on medicine bottles, doors, or cabinets, and when we rode our bikes, we had no helmets. (Not to mention hitchhiking to town as a young kid!) We drank water from the garden hose and not from a bottle. Horrors. We would spend hours building our go-carts out of scraps and then rode down the hill, only to find out we forgot the brakes. After running into the bushes a few times we learned to solve the problem. We would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as we were back when the streetlights came on. No one was able to reach us all day. No cell phones. Unthinkable.

We played dodgeball and sometimes the ball would really hurt.

We got cut and broke bones and broke teeth and there were no lawsuits from these accidents. They were accidents. No one was to blame but us. Remember accidents? We had fights and punched each other and got black and blue and learned to get over it. We ate cupcakes, bread and butter, and drank sugar soda but we were never overweight.....we were always outside playing. We shared one grape soda with four friends, from one bottle and no one died from this?

We did not have Playstations, Nintendo 64, X Boxes, video games at all, 99 channels on cable, video tape movies, surround sound, personal cellular phones, Personal Computers, internet chat rooms, we had friends. We went outside and found them. We rode bikes or walked to a friend's home and knocked on the door, or rung the bell or just walked in and talked to them. Imagine such a thing. Without asking a parent! By ourselves! Out there in the cold cruel world! Without a guardian. How did we do it? We made up games with sticks and tennis balls and ate worms and although we were told it would happen, we did not put out very many eyes, nor did the worms live inside us forever.

Little League had tryouts and not everyone made the team. Those who didn't had to learn to deal with disappointment.....Some students weren't as smart as others so they failed a grade and were held back to repeat the same grade.....Horrors! Tests were not adjusted for any reason. Our actions were our own. Consequences were expected. No one to hide behind. The idea of a parent bailing us out if we broke a law was unheard of. They actually sided with the law, imagine that!

This generation has produced some of the best risk-takers and problem-solvers and inventors, ever. The past 50 years has been an explosion of innovation and new ideas. We had freedom, failure, success and responsibility, and we learned how to accept, cope with, ignore and/or handle the situation.

And you're one of them.
