MARRIAGE RECORDS of Rev. N.G. Wright

Available in the Research Room are the Marriage Records of the Rev. Norris Garrison Wright who in 1934 was the oldest minister in the Saluda Baptist Association. He had the honor of never missing but one association meeting in 50 years. He married many people in Anderson County and kept records of those marriages. One of our members, William Donald Kay compiled the book Robert Norris Wright, Esquire 1812-1885: His Life and Four Generations of his Family, a copy of which is in our Research Room. From that source, we learn that Rev. N.G. Wright was a son of James Christopher Wright and a nephew of the Squire. James Christopher Wright was the Squire's younger brother. N.G. married Della Brock of Honea Path and had eleven children. His two old-maid daughters, Bert and Zuella, operated "Wright's Quality Shop" on the Square in Belton for many years. Both are now dead but the store remained under that name. The Wrights lived around Wright School and Bethany Church, where Rev. N. G. and many other Wrights were buried.

Reminiscences Of An Old Time Country Preacher

Rev. N. G. Wright Tells Of Days When Cold Water Was No Drawback to Being Baptized.

Typical of that school of old time preachers whose lengthy sermons left no doubt in the minds of the congregations as to the fate of the lost, who baptized their converts in the chill waters of the river and partook of fried chicken and pound cake at family dinner is the Reverend N. G. Wright, veteran Anderson county minister, and resident of Belton.

Though Mr. Wright, who has reached the venerable age of 83, is now retired from the active ministry, a call to fill the pulpit at Sunday services always finds him willing and ready, even though it be on short notice.

"All that I ask of them," he stated simply, "is to come after me and bring me back. My joints are too stiff to ride an old mule to church, as I started out doing or even to drive a Ford, as I used to do in later years. But my heart is still right where it was when I stood up to deliver my first sermon many years ago, and as long as I live I hope to continue being of service to my people and pointing out to them the right paths to follow.

"Times may have changed a lot since my congregations traveled for miles over muddy or ice-laden roads to attend services at the rude frame buildings we called meeting houses," he added seriously, "but the characteristics of a Christian life will never change, no matter how modern or how far advanced in science this world becomes. In my opinion, what we need today is more of the old time religion."

Mr. Wright, who has the distinction of being the oldest minister in the Saluda Baptist association, has probably filled the pulpits of more country churches in Anderson county than any other Baptist preacher. In a period of over 50 years he has never but once failed to attend an association meeting — and, according to his recollection, only one other time since his conversion at the age of seventeen.

"One of those times I couldn't go because I had broken my arm," he remarked. "The other time was on the day when my wife lay a corpse."

It is a coincidence that the first pastorate which he filled after he was ordained was also one of his last before retirement. This, according to his statement was Shiloh Baptist church. Now, in the winter of his life, the new leisure and quietness with which his days are filled do not mean days of idleness.

To one of Rev. Wright's callers it is a state forever to be shunned. Rather are his hours spent in reflection and study of his Bible, in countless other ways that serve to encourage his neighbors and friends and stir in them a response to his faith and trust. Rev. Wright is not a man whom time has passed by. His ideas are not outmoded but are, to the contrary broadened, enriched, and strengthened by his long observation of the trials and errors of human life. Clinging still to the things that have withstood the wear of earlier generations, he nevertheless looks upon modern day activities in a unimpaired manner. White-headed, kindly-eyed, and with a genial personality that is not devoid of a wholesome humor, he is the sort whom one might call a true friend and to whom he feels free to go in times of trouble. Indeed, his spare, slightly stooped shoulders might have been bowed by the bearing of others' burdens. Such an insight into the character of this old time preacher brings with it the desire to know in what way he has obtained such an enviable manner of living.

"I was born," he told us in answer to questioning, "in Martin township, Anderson county on December 20, 1851. With the coming of the Civil war my father enlisted as a Confederate soldier, and I took up the duties of the man of the house at the age of 10. My father never returned, and so the responsibilities that I had shouldered temporarily became mine for good. Many was the time, I remember, when I drove the wagon from the farm over the narrow, bad road to Anderson."

Destined to spend his youth in that unfortunate period of war-time and later poverty and unrest that was the aftermath, Mr. Wright's education was limited to the much sung reading, writing and arithmetic of the old field school and what study he carried on by himself. Going to school, working on the farm, and studying what little spare time he had was no small task. On Sundays he, with his mother and the other children dressed in their best and attended church services at Mt. Bethel. In that day one either hitched up the old mare to the wagon or buggy or rode horseback. Mr. Wright in his youthful years rode a mule.

"I was converted at the age of 17," he said, "and was baptized by Baxter Hayes. I had the idea ever since I was a child that I wanted to become a preacher, but I was not ordained until I was 40 years old."

The fact that he did not receive his license to preach until this late in life did not keep him from following his calling, however.

"I first began my church work through Sunday school and prayer meeting," he continued. "I was often called in to conduct prayer meetings, and I first began preaching regular sermons in school houses. I also conducted many funeral services."

These invitations served to pave the way for Mr. Wright's ultimate position as a minister. He had preached for ten years when he was finally ordained. Although he had not finished at a seminary, he had attended various Bible Institutes from which he had secured diplomas.

"I never had the opportunity of educational advantages," he said, "but I always felt that it didn't matter nearly so much how you said a thing as it did what you said. I've always said that I never wanted a big monument placed over my grave. What I want is a monument in the hearts of my people."

The minister's interest in studying the Bible, however, was manifested by the fact that as a child he learned the 14th chapter of John by memory before he knew how to read. Meanwhile upon being ordained, he received several calls, one of them being from Shiloh. A country preacher's work included filling the pulpit of at least four churches at one time and for which he received meager pay.

"There's no doubt about it," Mr. Wright laughed. "Churches were conducted along very different lines from what they are now. It was the custom then to have what we called conferences every Saturday. The church was the ruling power of those times and sat in judgment on the members of its congregation. Those who were found guilty of dancing, drunkenness, or any other unbecoming thing were turned out. We were somewhat narrow in views, perhaps, but frankly I believe conditions would be better now if the churches were stricter. Our law book was the Bible and the members conducted themselves accordingly."

After the Saturday conferences, the preacher always delivered his sermon, and on Sunday morning he again spoke before the congregation, on this occasion for as long as an hour. In this Mr. Wright varied from the custom of the old time preacher. As a general rule he never spoke longer than 25 minutes at a time, believing that a shorter, more condensed sermon would have more effect than a long drawn out one.

"You know, when I was a young man we didn't call the church building the church," he said with a quizzical smile. "In reality the church is the body who compose the organization. The building we called the meeting house, as in truth it was. They were all rude frame buildings, many of them not even sealed. In filling our pastorates we preachers usually had to travel a good many miles, bad weather or fair. When I first started the preacher's pay averaged about \$50 a year, which many times we didn't get, and board. But then I didn't go at it for money — I went at it for God. Preaching was not my only occupation."

Mr. Wright, who had married Miss Dell Brock of Honea Path, had a large family of eleven children to provide for.

"What time I wasn't preaching, I was plowing," he stated. "I never wrote out any of my sermons because I didn't have time, for one reason. I didn't have a study nor a desk nor any of the modern conveniences, but I didn't feel the necessity for them. As a matter of fact, the best sermons I ever preached were thought out between the plow handles."

"I have baptized people in every thing there is to be baptized in," he declared in speaking of this angle of church work. "Beginning with a brook dammed with mud to a church pool. I still prefer the river, however, as the real place for baptizing. I feel as if I'm following Jesus when the rite is performed there, where Jesus himself was baptized. I recall the time when I baptized 14 converts in the river at Andersonville one night after church. A pine knot burning on a boulder nearby which was our only light."

One man whom Mr. Wright baptized was six feet, four inches tall. He met the situation by submerging him by leading him out into water that came to his own neck. When baptizing women of considerable adiposities, however, the minister was forced to have the aid of someone else.

"I used to have a rubber baptizing suit," he continued. "It consisted of hip boots that extended on up to my waist and rubber sleeves. I soon abandoned it, though. It sprung a leak, and when the water poured in through the holes, it felt as if I were carrying a mountain."

Cold weather was no drawback to being baptized in the river then if the person were sufficiently anxious to go through with the rite without delay.

"Now they warm the water in the church pools," said Rev. Wright reflectively. "Humph — I never baptized anybody in warm water in my life, and I have taken people out to the river in cold weather. No water was ever heated for me. I remember, too, when

break the ice so that he could go in."

In all, he states, he has baptized around a "ousand converts. Among those whom he has baptized and ordained are J. S. Cobb, pastor of the Green Street church in Spartanburg and H. Haddock, pastor of a church in Union county.

The veteran preacher has had his ups and downs with the rest of his fellow men. He tells laughingly of several times when he delivered sermons to practically empty churches.

"On one occasion there were four people present," he recalled. "That was when there came a big snow. At another time there was a wet spell, and I preached to a congregation of one."

Making the rounds to call on the various members of his flock was much more difficult when the means of transportation was a horse and buggy and the way lay over treacherous country lanes. But according to Wright, the country folk were always cordial and he received many an invitation to fried chicken dinners.

Serving in his capacity as pastor, Rev. Wright has married over 450 couples and, as he declared smiling, is still going strong. Although he has never charged for performing the marriage ceremony, he has only twice failed to receive pay.

"What," we asked, "do you think about using the word, obey, in the covenant? Do you still use it?"

"I do not," he answered emphatically, "and I never have. I think marriage is a 50-50 affair, and a wife is under no more obligation to obey her husband than a husband is to obey his wife. Besides, obedience isn't necessary if the heart is where it should be. There is another covenant, you know, where the bride promises to be her husband's faithful servant. I've never used that one either. A couple has never asked me to leave out the word, obey, but one woman did ask me not to use the word, servant, in the covenant."

Significant of Mr. Wright's progressive efforts is the fact that he has never failed to contribute something toward the improvement of every church building where he has served. He it was who organized Triangle church, starting first by preaching in a school house on the site which was later replaced by a real house of worship. Since he was ordained at Bethany he has served as pastor of some 20 odd churches. Although his pastorates have included such places as Greenville and Belton, he states that he has always felt closer to the country churches, probably because they still retain some of the "old time religion." For the past 23 years he has resided in Belton where he is a member of the First Baptist church.

In speaking of the ministers of today, Rev. Wright declared, "I am very glad that they have more to start out on now than we did years ago. Although I do feel that old time preaching had some advantages that the modern does not, I believe in the progress that has been made and feel that those who follow the call of the ministry have a great work before them. Knowledge has advanced with time, and today the student of Bible must go much more deeply into study. But in the meanwhile, he must not forget to study about pleading the Lord as well."

Certainly in summing up his own life, this preacher of the old school may feel that he has truthfully carried out that passage of scripture which has gone with him from childhood, "Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life."

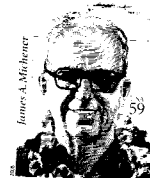

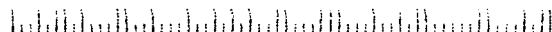
