Martin Township

Martin township is so named in honor of one of its best loved and most prominent citizens of the earlier time. Colonel John Martin, who was born September 1st, 1793. He lived and died on the place where he was born. His father was Roderick Martin, one of the pioneer settlers of the Varennes section. His mother was a widow, Mrs. Taylor, when she married Mr. Martin and John was the only child of that marriage. When only nineteen vears old Mr. Martin volunteered in Captain Thomas' company, composed of Pendleton and Abbeville men, and served in the war of 1812. At the time of his death in 1880 he was probably the last survivor of that company. As long as he lived he drew a pension for services in that war.

John Martin married Cynthia Rutledge, daughter of another pioneer settler of what later became Anderson County, whose home stood about where was located what was long known as "The James F. Drake place." To this couple was born 16 children, 11 of whom lived to be grown, eight sons and three daughters.

Mr. Martin's early experience in war gave him a taste for the military and in early life he became captain of "Bear Creek Company," and later colonel in the Fourth Regiment of SC Militia. In 1832 Colonel Martin represented his county in the legislature. In 1836 he became ordinary of the county. In 1846 Colonel Martin was elected sheriff and again he held that office in 1854. He was a delegate from Anderson county to the state convention which passed the ordinance of secession in 1859. When in 1860 volunteers were called for he enlisted in Captain Anderson's company and went with the company to Columbia. He took with him his old rifle which he called "Old Friday." The authorities appreciated his patriotism, but decided that he was too old for service, he being at that time 67 years of age. It was with difficulty however that the old man was persuaded to return home and leave the fighting to younger men.

Colonel Martin was quite a sportsman and hunter especially wild turkevs which were abundant in his day.

Although a man of fine moral character, he never united with any church and was on that account the source of great grievance to the preachers of his locality.

Colonel Martin was immensely popular in his community and a most useful and honored citizen.

There are many descendants in the county today and many scattered throughout other states.

Martin Township embraces the old Ebenezer church neighborhood, the first Methodist church of the county, and its nearby school, which exercised a great influence in its day, one of the first schools of the section. The old church stands on the old road between Anderson and Abbeville, about a mile from Rocky river and ten miles from the county seat. Several roads cross and diverge there forming something of a center. In the same neighborhood were the old Varennes Presbyterian church and Baptist church, all among the first churches of the county.

Several other families prominent in the annals of Anderson county settled first in that neighborhood: among them that of Mr. Elijah Brown, one of the pillars of Old Ebenezer church and a man who stood for education and progress. He also has many descendants in the county and the city who have contributed much to the uplift of the community.
