NEW CEMETERY LAWS

Just recently, the state of South Carolina passed a new law that pertains to the preservation and protection of cemeteries. In summary, this shows that SC is willing to help preserve the memories of our pasted loved ones, backed by the Attorney General.

- A. Counties and municipalities are now authorized to preserve and protect any cemetery within its jurisdiction that they determine has been abandoned or is not being maintained and are further authorized to expend public funds and use county or municipal inmate labor, in the manner authorized by law in connection with the cemetery.
- B. As used in this section, the term "preserve and protect" means to keep safe from destruction, peril and other adversity and may include the placement of signs, marker, fencing, or other appropriate features so as to identify the site as a cemetery and so aid in the preservation and protection of the abandoned cemetery.

Dear Anderson County Chapter, I just wanted to say thank you a million times a million. For years, I have been trying to track down exactly where in SC my **Adams/Bevil** family was from. I did not have one thing to go on except an old family suspicion that it was somewhere around Anderson or Pickens Co, Today while looking for Benjamin Bowden, whom I know was buried in Anderson County, somewhere in 1840, I was clicking around your site hoping for a will or estate record. I happened upon your newsletter with the accounts of the Thompson's store. You just can't imagine my shock at seeing Dicy **Bevil** and her sister Louisa AND Dicy's husband John **Adams**...all in the same accounts for 1834. Bless you over and over, for being generous enough to post those recent newsletters. I had literally just hung the phone up from talking to my daughter who had driven all the way to Columbia to see what if anything she could find on our various brickwalls. I told her there wasn't any point in looking for John and Dicy as they had been married in SC so long ago and SC had no marriage records. I told her there was no point wasting precious time since many people had been searching all these years and no one had ever found where they were in SC. Really searching for a "John Adams" is misery. I hung up the phone and came to the computer and POW...25 years..and there they were. Can you tell I am excited!!!!!! QUERIES

Finding a Black man in Anderson County named Caesar is like finding a gold-brick on some street corner. For years, I have been trying to find the grave of the following "Black" Caesar.

One of the Big Creek Baptist church members named Caesar, was rather an unusual character. He was a preacher of considerable influence. He had been a Slave who saved enough to buy his own freedom and later bought his brother. The land just above the place where Rush and Vandiver's planning mill once stood, was owned by Caesar. He was buried in a field just in the rear of the old Williamston Female College buildings (estimate N34 37.133 x W82 28.717). In the records, it is stated that "Brother Caesar made application to go about and exercise his gift." Sometimes his request was granted, sometimes refused. Caesar was once excluded from fellowship for persisting over the protest of the church in taking an additional wife. Later he was restored to fellowship, what befell wife #2 is not stated. He was admonished to preach "sound-doctrine" on his preaching expeditions. Sometimes he held services for the Big Creek congregation. Once "Brother Caesar" was up before the church for having knocked down with an axe a fellow servant. By: **Traditions and History of Anderson County**, by Louise Ayer **Vandiver** in 1928

I was reading your newsletter and I notice that in 1905, there was a Caesar **ARNOLD**. His occupation was a driver. It also said residence cemetery beyond limits - I have no idea what that means... Would you check the balance of this survey that you have and see if there are any other Caesar's?

Note: If anyone knows any more about this man, please respond to this query. Is Caesar Arnold the man described above? His residence at the time (1905) was beyond the city limits and past a cemetery. It is possible that the only cemetery of note was Old Silver Brook and this man lived in that direction toward what is now the Nevitt Forest school area or out Highway 29 towards Williamston, past Eureka Baptist Church Cemetery. Comments?
