I, Robert Milton Stevenson, of Due West in the said state and county, being of sound and disposing mind, memory, and understanding, but somewhat advanced in years and desiring to make disposition of my property at my death, do hereby make, publish, and declare the following to be and for my last will and testament, to wit:

Item one. I will and direct that my executors disburse named, as soon after my death as practicable pay all my just debts, including the expenses of my last illness and my funeral expenses, and that they do erect at my last resting place a suitable marker in my family plot in the cemetery at Due West, S.C.

Item two. I will and bequeath to my three children, Robert Mason Stevenson, Ralph Brinkley Stevenson, and Laurence Broomee Stevenson, each the sum of Ten Dollars. I make no further bequest or devise in their favor at this present and for the reason that my said three children are well provided for in life and desire my estate to go to their older brothers and sister.

Item 3. I will and bequeath to my son William Hartin Stevenson my servants together with the books in my library.

Item 4. I will and devise to my daughter Mary Stevenson Butts, the house and lot, and the furniture and furnishings therein belonging to me in the town of Due West where I now reside, and said lot containing Seventy six acre hundredths of an acre and bounded by lots of E. L. Reid, W. H. Edwards, and Cedar Street.

Item 5. I will and devise to my son, William Hartin Stevenson my lawn place, containing Sixty one and one fourth acres more or less, and lying about one mile Southeast of Due West, adjoining lands of J. T. Ellis, R. G. Ellis and others.

Item 6. I will and devise to my son, Calvin Briner Stevenson, my tract of land known as the Todd Place, lying on the Due West - Danalda road, adjoining lands of C. B.
