Fifth. I will, devise and bequeath all of my household furniture, except the table referred to in Item 7, of the will, to Miss Annie S. Bell.

Sixth. I direct that Item 10 be stricken out of said will and instead I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Annie S. Bell, as executrix of my said last will and testament and this codicil.

loaned prior to my death shall equal a three tenths part of my estate up to \$10,000.00. This fund may be spoken of as an Educational Revolving Loan Fund, and it is my wish that the applicants for a loan be approved by a board made up of the ministers of the following four original churches of Abbeville, S.C., the Associate Reformed Presbyterian, the Presbyterian, the Baptist, and the Methodist. The conditions governing the selection for such approval shall include among other things that the young person shall be of White Gentile descent, and shall have been a resident of Abbeville County for at least 12 years. The board referred to above shall also satisfy itself of the applicant's seriousness of purpose, and shall impress upon the applicant that the acceptance of a loan from this fund places upon him or her a trust and tha every borrower will be expected to seriously carry out the terms of the loan, and these terms shall be written into the instrument evidencing the loan, and each borrower must be impressed with the fact that they are trustees of this fund, and upon them depends the continuation of said fund, and that, when they fail to repay, the fund will be diminished as set out below, and upon their shoulders is set the responsibility of extending the opportunity to others that follow them. The maximum loan per year shall be \$100.00 or \$400.00 for the college course. The loans shall not bear interest until the course is abandoned or the borrower receives his or her diploma. The loan shall then bear interest at 5% per annum or fraction thereof. The borrower must pay all of the interest and some portion of the principal each year to show their earnest desire to repay the loan, unless prevented misfortune, sickness, or similar cause. Should a borrower fail to repay any sum due then it is my desire that the fund be diminished by a like amount being transferred into the hands of my niece, Miss Annie S. Bell, as treasurer of the transferred fund, of which she is to receive one third; Thornwell Orphanage at Clinton, S. C. one third, and the Junior Order of United American Mechanics one third. After her death the other two beneficiaries may name a tresurer who is to act without compensation, and the share that would have gone to my niece shall then to to the two institutions in equal shares. May it be understood that there is no desire on my part that the institutions named above share in this particular fund but this provision is made so that my plan for helping young people obtain an education may be tried out by them and the fact determined by them whether it is practical, if by them it fails then I wish the fund to go to the godp causes fostered by these institutions.

Item 7. I direct that the folding leaf table which I have in my possession that once belonged to my grandfather, LeRoy C. Wilson, be offered for sale by sealed bids to the descendants of the said LeRoy C. Wilson and if as many as three such bids are received it be sold to the one who is the highest bidder. Should so many not be received then it is my desire that it be sold at public auction to the highest bidder.

Item 8. The provisions made in the foregoing paragraphs under Items 3, 4, 5 and 6 are made upon the assumption that my estate shall net \$10,000.00 at the time of my death, if it is less than that sum, then the items shall be fulfilled proportionately.

Item 9. The above provisions having been made for the distribution of my estate up to the sum of \$10,000 as set out, it is my desire should it net more than that sum that the said remainder of my estate go to my nephews and nieces in equal shares, namely; Len R. Bell, George A. Bell, H. LeRoy Miller, Florence Miller, and Mrs. Ada Blackwood.

Item 10. I hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint Erskine Link and Annie S. Bell, as executor and executrix of this my last will and testament. I direct that the said Annie S. Bell shall act without compensation, she having been favored otherwise in this will.
