A. The Trustee shall divide all of my household furniture and furnishings and personal effects between my children then in life and shall deliver the same to said children at such time or times, as in his discretion, he shall deem best.

B. The Trustee shall hold, manage, invest and reinvest said property for the benefit of my daughter, MARY CAROLINE MILLER, and my son, ROBERT D. MILLER, and shall distribute both the principal and income therefrom in the manner hereinafter set out.

C. The Trustee shall use so much of the net income and principal of the trust estate as in his sole discretion may be necessary for the maintenance, care, support and education of my said children, subject only to the provisions of paragraph D of this Item.

ITEM III continued

D. At the time of making this Will my daughter, MARY CAROLINE MILLER, is twenty years of age and is in college; my son, ROBERT D. MILLER, is fourteen years of age. It is my desire that both my son and daughter shall be given four years of education at a college or other similar educational institutions.

In the event I should die before my daughter has completed her college education, I direct that my Trustee shall continue to pay the costs of such education for her and shall pay the costs of her maintenance and support during such period of education. In the event, however, my said daughter shall not have completed her college education on or before her twenty-fifth birthday, no further sum shall be paid to her until the termination of this trust as hereinafter provided.

In the event my son shall not have completed his college education at the time of my death, I direct that my Trustee shall pay the costs of such education for him and shall pay the costs of his maintenance and support during such period of education. In the event, however, my said son shall not have completed his college education on or before his twenty-fifth birthday, no further sum shall be paid to him until the termination of this trust as hereinafter provided.

E. This trust shall be terminated as follows:

1. If my said son survives to attain his twenty-fifth birthday, this trust shall terminate on said date and the Trustee is directed to distribute the trust property then remaining in his hands in equal shares to my children, ROBERT D. MILLER and MARY CAROLINE MILLER.

2. If my said son does not survive to attain his twenty-fifth birthday, then this trust shall terminate upon my said daughter's reaching her twenty-fifth birthday or upon my said son's death, whichever is the later of the two events; and upon such termination, the Trustee shall distribute to my said daughter, MARY CAROLINE MILLER, the entire trust property then remaining in his hands.

E. 3. If my said daughter predeceases my said son, before the distribution to her of her share of my estate, I direct my Trustee to distribute the entire trust property then remaining in his hands to my said son upon his twenty-fifth birthday.

F. In the event both of my said children shall have died before distribution of the trust property as herein provided, I direct that, upon the death of my last child, my Trustee shall distribute the trust property then remaining in his hands to the persons who would be entitled to receive the same under the laws of descent and distribution then in force in the State of Georgia, if I had died intestate.

ITEM IV

I hereby constitute and appoint as Executrix of this Will my wife, MARY H. MILLER, provided she survives me. In the event my said wife should predecease me or fail, refuse or for any reason be unable to serve, then I constitute and appoint as Executor my brother, EMMETT H. MILLER, SR.

ITEM V

In the management, care and disposition of my estate and of the trust estate above provided for, I confer upon the Executrix and Executor of this Will and the Trustee herein named, and their successors in office, the power to do all things and execute such instruments as may be deemed necessary or proper, including the following powers, all of which may be exercised without order of or report to any Court:

A. To sell, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any property at any time held or acquired under this Will, at public or private sale, for cash or on terms, without advertisement, including the right to lease for any term notwithstanding the period of the trust;

B. To invest all monies in such stocks, bonds, securities, mortgages, notes, choses in action, real estate, improvements thereon, and other property as such Executrix, Executor or Trustee may deem best without regard to any law now or hereafter in force limiting the investment for executors, trustees, or other fiduciaries;

C. To retain by way of investment any property or choses in action owned by me at the time of my death;

D. To use real estate brokers, accountants, attorneys at law, and other agents, if deemed necessary and desirable, and to pay reasonable compensation for their services;

E. To compromise, settle and/or adjust any claim or demand by or against said estate or trust and to agree to any rescission or modification of any contract or agreement affecting such estate or trust;

F. To borrow money for any purpose that to the Trustee may seem proper and to secure the payment thereof by the whole or any part of the trust estate, and a lender of money shall be under no obligation whatsoever to see to the purpose for which the money is borrowed or the use of the proceeds of any such loan;

G. In the distribution of my estate, the Trustee is authorized to make distribution in money or in kind, or partly in money and partly in kind, and the division made by my Trustee and the values established by him for such division shall be binding and conclusive on all persons taking hereunder. In making such division, undivided interests in the same property may be allotted to several shares, or interests.

No Executrix, Executor nor Trustee shall be required to make or file any inventory or appraisement or to file any annual or other returns or reports to any Court or to give any bond, or to secure any order or consent of any Court to carry out any of the powers conferred on them, but shall furnish at least annually a statement of receipts and disbursements to each person then entitled to an interest in my estate or the trust herein provided.

ITEM VII

In the event either or both of my said children are minors at the time of my death, if my wife, MARY H. MILLER, has predeceased me, I nominate and appoint as the guardian of the person of my minor child or children my brother, EMMETT H. MILLER, SR.
