7. My wife, Callie A. Gilliam, now owns an oak den set, consisting of five chairs, two tables, and a bookcase, and if my said wife does not survive me, and I should have acquired ownership of this oak den set at the time of my death, as an heir or devisee or otherwise, from my wife, I give and bequeath this oak den set to Dr. F. C. McLane, my nephew, who resides at Ware Shoals,

South Carolina.

8. My wife, Callie A. Gilliam, now owns a large oversize bed, together with mattress and springs, and if my said wife does not survive me, and I should have acquired ownership of this oversize bed, mattress and springs at the time of my death, as an heir or devisee, or otherwise, from my wife, I give and bequeath this large oversize bed, with mattress and springs, to Margaret Grindstaff, a niece of my wife, of Glen Ellyn, Illinois.

9. My wife, Callie A. Gilliam, now owns a number of volumes of books, and if my said wife does not survive me, and I should have acquired ownership of these books at the time of my death, as an heir or devisee, or otherwise, from my wife, I give and bequeath these books to Charles Miller and Sam Miller of Abbeville County, South Carolina, children of my niece, Jennie R. Miller.

10. If my wife does not survive me, and I should have acquired ownership of her personal jewelry at the time of my death, as an heir or devisee, or otherwise, from my wife, I give, and bequeath the personal jewelry acquired from my said wife, to Sara Stegall, niece of my wife, of Anderson County, South Carolina.

11. All other furniture, furnishings, rugs, pictures, books, linen, glassware, apparel, and all other household goods and effects, (excluding money, securities, and other items of like nature), located within my residence house, not hereinabove willed and bequeathed, I give and bequeath to James E. Moates, my nephew, of Aiken, South Carolina.




