

Last Will and Testament

I, CHARLOTTE N. CLAY

of Abbeville County, South Carolina, being of sound and disposing mind and memory and desiring to make such disposition of my worldly estate as I deem best, DO HEREBY MAKE, PUBLISH AND DECLARE THIS TO BE MY LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, hereby revoking any and all former wills and codicils whatever by me made.

First: I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as conveniently may be and to that end charge my whole estate, real and personal, with the same.

Second: I give, devise and bequeath to my husband, Gerald R. Clay, all of my real and personal property, of whatever kind and nature, wherever situated, in fee simple, absolute, and forever.

In the event my husband and I should die in a common disaster, or he not survive me to probate this Will, and in that event only, I give, devise, and bequeath unto my son, Merrill Adams, the sum of Fifteen Thousand and No/100 (\$15,000.00) Dollars of which he will receive Five Thousand and No/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollars at my death, and the remainder when he attains to the age of thirty (30) years. Unto my son, Michael Adams, I give the sum of Fifteen Thousand and No/100 (\$15,000.00) Dollars of which he will receive Five Thousand and No/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollars at my death, and the remainder when he attains to the age of thirty (30) years. Unto Angela Clay I give the sum of Ten Thousand and No/100 (\$10,000.00) Dollars to be paid to her when she attains to the age of twenty-five (25) years. Unto Sarah Elizabeth Clay and Billy Clay I give the sum of Five Thousand and No/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollars each which is to be used for their education after high school, and if they fail to maintain adequate passing grades beyond high school the sum is to be paid over to them when they attain to the age of twenty-five (25) years. All of the funds set forth in this paragraph not disbursed at my death are to be placed in individual savings accounts by the Trustee, hereinafter named, for the individual debisees.

I give, devise, and bequeath my house to Merrill and Michael Adams, and the furniture therein to Angela Clay, Merrill and Michael Adams in equal shares. My house trailer and all the contents therein I will to Angela Clay, along with all of my silver, sterling silver and flatware, china and crystal.

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son, Merrill Adams, as Trustee of Michael, Angela, Sarah Elizabeth, and Billy, and as Executor of this Will in the event my husband, Gerald R. Clay, predeceases me, and in that event only.
