ITEM IV:

My Trustee is to use the income, and if necessary, in the sole judgment of my Trustee, the corpus of the trust for the maintenance, support and education of my son, J. Steven Brown, and my said Trustee is hereby authorized and directed to pay the income from said trust either to the beneficiary thereof or on his behalf, that is to say that my Trustee is authorized in his discretion to pay the income from the trust estate directly to the beneficiary thereof, even though the beneficiary shall have not reached his majority; provided that at the time my son, J. 


Last Will and Testament

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN!

I, Sumner W. Brown, of the Town of McCormick, County of McCormick, State of South Carolina, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby add this Codicil to my Last Will and Testament, which Last Will and Testament is dated September 12, 1968, amending and/or changing my said Will in the respects hereinbelow set out, but otherwise leaving my said Will intact.

ITEM I:

Item III of my Last Will and Testament is amended as follows:

Add the following proviso:

"Provided, however, that in the event my son, J. Steven Brown, shall marry before he completes college with a batchelors degree or its equivalent and he is otherwise capable and under no physical or mental infirmities which would prevent his completion of college work, then the trust herein created shall immediately terminate and my Trustee shall distribute and pay over to the American Cancer Society all accumulated income and the corpus of this trust.

ITEM II:

Item V of my Last Will and Testament is amended to read as follows:

I hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint Julius H. Baggett, as Trustee of this my Last Will and Testament; provided, however, that should the said Julius H. Baggett die before completing the duties of the Trust or should fail or refuse to qualify or should resign as such, then, in either event, I appoint J. Fred Buzhardt, Jr. as Trustee.

ITEM III:

Item VI of my Last Will and Testament is amended by striking the name, "J. Fred Buzhardt, Jr." and inserting in lieu thereof the name "Julius H. Baggett".

I further direct that all estate and inheritance taxes assessed with respect to my estate herein disposed of, or any part thereof, or on any bequest or devise contained in this my Will (which term wherever used herein shall include any codicil hereto), or on any insurance upon my life or on property held jointly by me with another, or on any transfer made by me during my lifetime be paid out of my residuary estate as administration expenses.

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Fourth: All of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate of every kind and description (including lapsed legacies and devises), after the payment of my funeral expenses, debts, administration expenses and estate, inheritance and similar taxes, I devise and bequeath to my daughter, Virginia Carolyn Gable Nelson, or to her descendants, per stirpes, if she then be not surviving.

Fifth: If any beneficiary under this my Will shall die with me, or with any person then entitled to receive trust income hereunder, in a common accident or disaster, under circumstances as to render it difficult to determine or doubtful which died first, I direct that such beneficiary shall be conclusively deemed not to have survived me or such person, as the case may be; provided, however, if my wife shall die with me as aforesaid, I direct that she shall be conclusively deemed to have survived me.

Sixth: Without limitation of the powers conferred upon her by statute or general rules of law, my Executrix is specifically authorized and empowered:

(1) To retain any property owned by me at the time of my death;

(2) To sell or otherwise dispose of any property, real or personal, at any time forming a part of my estate for cash or upon credit, in such manner and on such terms and conditions as she may deem best, and no person dealing with her shall be bound to see to the application of any moneys paid;

(3) To employ such attorneys, accountants, agents, clerks, custodians, investment counsel and other persons as she may deem necessary in the administration of my estate or

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any trust hereunder, and to pay them such compensation as she may deem proper;

(4) To compromise, settle or arbitrate any claim or obligation to or from me or my estate, and to reduce the rate of interest on, to extend or otherwise modify, or to enforce, any such obligation;

(5) To vote on any securities by discretionary proxy or otherwise, and to join in or oppose any reorganization, recapitalization, consolidation sale or merger;

(6) To deposit any securities or property with any protective or similar committee, to delegate discretionary power thereto, and to pay a share of its expenses and compensation;

(7) To enforce, or to abstain from the enforcement of, any right, obligations or claim, and to abandon, if in her absolute discretion she shall deem it advisable, any property, at any time forming part of my estate;

(8) My Executrix may borrow such funds as may be necessary, or in her opinion desirable, in order to pay any debts, taxes or other expenses in connection with the administration of my estate, and to use any assets held by her as Executrix for the purpose of furnishing collateral security therefor;

(9) To distribute in cash or in kind upon any division of my estate or the termination of any trust hereunder; and,

(10) In general, to exercise all powers in the management of my estate which any individual could exercise in the management of similar property owned in his own right, upon such terms and conditions as to her may seem best, and to execute

SECOND: If both of my sisters, Oney Morse and Cara Morse, shall predecease me, all property, both real, personal, and mixed, which I shall own at my death, and all property over which I shall then have any power of appointment, I give, will, devise and bequeath absolutely and in fee simple to my brother and sisters, in equal shares, and the then living descendants, if any, of any of them which predecease me, per stirpes.

THIRD: I appoint my brother, Joel S. Morse, and my sister, Mamie L. Morse, trustees of any and all trusts hereby created, and in case either of them should fail to qualify, or cease to act as trustee, I appoint the other as sole trustee. FIFTH: Without undertaking to distinguish between the duties and powers of my executor, or trustees, and by way of illustration and not of limitation of his powers, I hereby authorize my executor, or my trustee, as follows:

(1) To sell any property, real or personal, publicly or privately, for cash or on time, without an Order of Court, upon such terms and conditions as to him shall seem best, without liability on the part of the purchaser to see to the application of the purchase money.

(2) To retain any of the original investments or other property constituting my estate at the time of my death, regardless of the character of said investments

or other property or whether they be such as are authorized by law for investment by fiduciaries, for such time as to him shall seem best, and to dispose of any such property by sale or exchange or otherwise as and when he shall deem advisable; and to invest and reinvest funds in such investments as he may desire, without the Order of the Court.

(4) To make distribution in cash or in kind or partly in cash and partly in kind, not necessarily rateably, but on the basis of the value according to his own judgment.

SIXTH: I request that no executor, executrix, or trustees hereunder be required to give any bond.

SEVENTH: I request that no trustees be required to give any accounting to any Court, and that no accounting shall be given to the beneficiaries of the trust except by written request by such beneficiary.

EIGHTH: Throughout this Will the masculine gender shall be deemed to include the feminine, and the singular the plural, and vice versa.

NINETH: Throughout this Will the words "my sisters" shall be deemed to include my sisters of the whole blood, and my sister of the half blood, Emily Morse Cook.
