Should my said Trustee feel it necessary to use any or all of the principal of said fund, he is hereby authorized to do so in keeping with good business principles as may be for the general welfare and comfort of my beloved wife, Ellen. Further, should my son, Benson Carwile McWhite, predecease my wife, Ellen, it is my desire and I do hereby direct that (Mrs.) Martha McWhite, wife of my son, be vested with the above trusteeship. After the death of my beloved wife, Ellen, if there be a residue of the above trust fund, I will and direct that it go to my son, if he be living, or to his children, including step children, per stirpes.

Item V: All the rest and residue of my estate, I devise, bequeath (or will) to my son, Benson Carwile McWhite; or, in case he passes away before the closing of my estate, to his children, including step children, per stirpes.

Item VI: I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son, Benson Carwile McWhite, Executor, and his wife, Martha A. McWhite, Executrix, or the Survivor, to this my Last Will and Testament, with full power and authority to do any and everything necessary to carry into full force and effect this my Last Will and Testament, directing that they be permitted to qualify as such without the giving of a bond, or other security, in any jurisdiction.

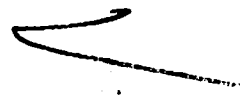

B. Carwile, Jr., 1 clock (Luther Haddon's) and 1 TV set; to Alice (Mrs. A. B. Carwile, Sr.) 1 set of glassware, formerly Aunt Lizzie's, with request that it go to her grand-daughter Kayren at any desirable time, and also some cedar lumber at the farm; to Alice (Mrs. R. H.
