

my youngest child attains the age of 21 years and said deceased child leave a child or children, then in that event, said child or children of my deceased child shall receive the share of the deceased child the same as if said child had been in life at the time of making the division, that is, when my youngest child becomes 21 years old.

I further hereby expressly confer on them the authority and power to borrow money for the use of my estate, in any instance where they may think it necessary and proper, and to secure the same by lien, mortgage, security deed, or trust deed, or other form of security to or upon any part of my estate, all of which they may do without the order of any Court.
