1. I give and bequeath all of my personal and household effects of every kind including but not limited to furniture, appliances, furnishings, pictures, books, jewelry and wearing apparel to my wife, MARIE L. KING, if she shall survive me.

2. If my wife, MARIE L. KING, shall survive me, I give, devise and bequeath to my wife cash, bank accounts, real estate or other property of my estate (undiminished by any estate, inheritance, succession, death or similar taxes) having a value equal to fifty (50%) per cent of the value of my adjusted gross estate as finally determined for federal estate tax purposes, less the aggregate amount of marital deductions, if any, allowed for such tax purposes by reason of property or interests in property passing or which have passed to my wife otherwise than by terms of this item. My Executrix shall have the sole discretion to select the assets which shall constitute this bequest. In no event however shall there be included in this bequest any asset or the proceeds of any asset which will not qualify for the federal estate tax marital deduction, and this bequest shall be reduced to the extent that it cannot be credited with such qualifying assets. I direct my Executrix to value any asset selected by my executor to be distributed in kind in satisfaction of this bequest at the value of such asset at the date of distribution of such asset.

3. If my wife shall survive me, I give, devise, and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my property of every kind and description, wherever situate and whether acquired before or after the execution of this will to my trustee hereinafter named, and shall be held, administered and

(1) Commencing with the date of my death, my trustee shall pay to or apply for the benefit of my said wife until her death all the net income from the trust in convenient installments.

(2) My Trustee may pay to or apply for the benefit of my said wife such sums from the principal of the trust as in her sole discretion shall be necessary or advisable from time to time for the medical care, comfortable maintenance, and welfare of my said wife, taking into consideration to the extent my trustee deems advisable, any other income or resources of my said wife known to my trustee.

(3) Upon or after the death of the survivor of my said wife and me my trustee shall divide and distribute this trust as then constituted into two equal separate shares so as to provide one share for each then living child of mine and one share for each deceased child of mine who shall leave issue then living, to be distributed among her issue in equal shares.

4. If my wife does not survive me, I give, devise and bequeath my entire estate, real and personal, and all property over which I shall have any power of disposition by will, whether acquired before or after the execution of this will, to my children, in equal shares, or their issue per stirpes if any of them do not survive me.

5. The provisions made in this will for my wife, MARIE L. KING, are in lieu of and abar to dower.

6. I appoint my daughters, VERNER K. DICKSON and MARIE K. ANDERSON, Executrixes and Trustees of this my will. If either of them shall fail to qualify or cease to act as Executrix or Trustee, I appoint the other as sole Executrix and Trustee. I direct neither shall be required to furnish any bond.



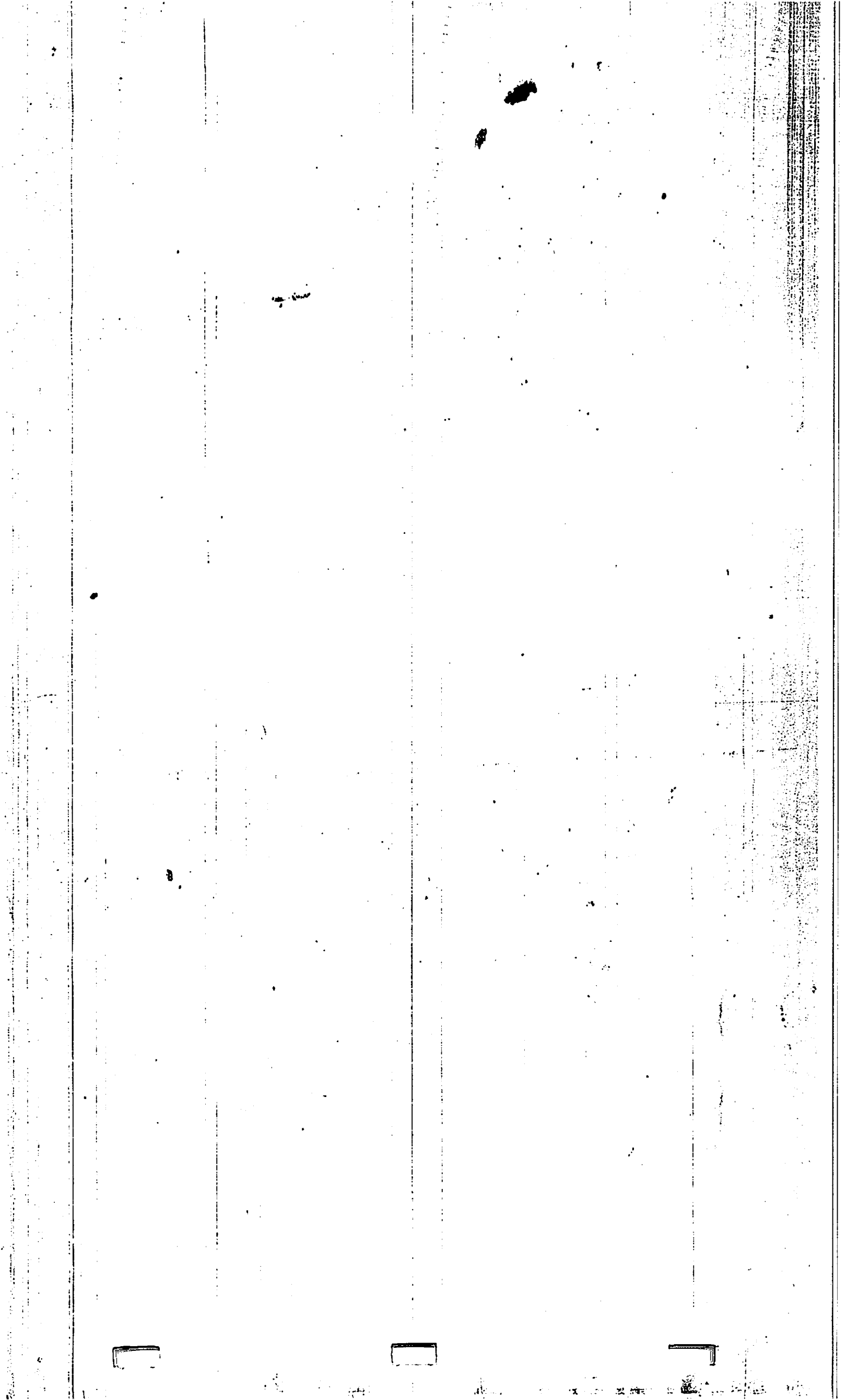


